PUBLIC QUESTION No. 1

An act authorizing the creation of a debt of the State of New Jersey by the issuance of bonds of the State in the sum of fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000.00) for State buildings, their construction, reconstruction, development, extension, improvement, equipment and facilities, for welfare and educational uses; providing the ways and means to pay the interest of said debt and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof; and providing for the submission of this act to the people at a general election.

PUBLIC QUESTION No. 2

Shall the act entitled "An act authorizing the creation of a debt of the State of New Jersey by the issuance of bonds of the State in the principal amount of fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00) to pay for the establishment and construction of a high speed transit system for the southern area of the State; providing for the ways and means to pay the interest on such debt, and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof; providing for the designation or creation of an "authority" to establish, construct, operate and maintain such transit system; and providing for the submission of this act to the people at a general election for adoption or rejection," take effect?
