At lunch, portion sizes planned for each component must meet both daily and weekly minimum requirements for each appropriate grade group. When planning menus, refer to the Lunch Meal Pattern Charts, available on the Department of Agriculture's Form web site for specific component and minimum quantity requirements.

Chicken nuggets and an Uncrustable sandwich with cheese stick are both daily lunch offerings. The chicken nuggets provides 2oz equivalent meat/meat alternate and 1 oz equivalent grain components. The Uncrustable sandwich with cheese stick provides 2oz equivalent meat/meat alternate and 1 oz equivalent grain components. The site reviewed is a HS and since the 9-12 age/grade grouping meal pattern is 2oz equivalent of grain daily, the daily meal pattern is not being met.

In addition, since both these meals are daily offerings, only 5oz grain is offered for the week for each item. The weekly requirements of grain for the 9-12 age/grade grouping is 10-12 oz equivalents, therefore the weekly grain component is also not met.

This is considered insufficient quantities and is a Performance Standard 2 (PS2) violation. This is a first offense. Failure to fix identified issues may also lead to fiscal action/repeat violations in subsequent reviews.
