

2015-2016 SCHOOLS APPLICATION PACKET

The NJ Department of Agriculture's JERSEY FRESH FARM TO SCHOOL RECOGNITION **PROGRAM** highlights efforts that bring produce from New Jersey's farms into school cafeterias. Initiatives include school gardening, farm visits, and culinary classes and the integration of food-related education into the regular, standards-based classroom curriculum. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) supports the program, through research, training, technical assistance, and grants.

Participation in the **JERSEY FRESH FARM TO SCHOOL RECOGNITION PROGRAM** will recognize and promote your school's efforts to serve **Jersey Fresh** produce and support local agriculture. This recognition program is an opportunity to expand your school's farm to school efforts and highlight **Jersey Fresh** produce in your school meals. Locally grown produce is healthy and has a crisp, flavorful taste students will enjoy. This program encompasses endless educational opportunities to learn about good nutrition and the New Jersey agricultural industry.

Participating schools will receive an exclusive *Jersey Fresh Farm to School* promotional materials kit for use in the school cafeteria and to inform your community about your participation in the program. The kit will include *Jersey Fresh Farm to School* logo items such as a banner, aprons, pencils, pins, key chains, and a flash drive containing program and media templates to customize announcements of your farm to school activities.

NJ DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE JERSEY FRESH FARM TO SCHOOL RECOGNITION PROGRAM

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In January 2011, Governor Christie signed legislation establishing the last week of September every year as "*Jersey Fresh* Farm to School Week." This year *Jersey Fresh* Farm to School Week is September 21 – 25. The objectives of the week are:

- Strengthen children's and the school communities' knowledge about agriculture and nutrition
- Increase children's consumption of *Jersey Fresh* fruits and vegetables
- Increase market opportunities for farmers

I. EXPECTATIONS OF PARTICIPATING SCHOOLS:

Jersey Fresh Farm to School Week, September 21 – 25, 2015:

- Plan at least one (1) promotion/event during the annual *Jersey Fresh* Farm to School Week. Provide NJDA School Nutrition staff with documentation, including pictures (with signed releases), flyers, menus, copies of web postings, etc.
- Menu and serve at least one (1) *Jersey Fresh* item **each day**. Documentation must be provided for the product served and farm from which it was sourced.
- Highlight a "Did You Know?" fact during morning announcements about a local fruit or vegetable being served.

National Farm to School Month, October 2015:

- Plan at least one (1) promotion/event during October's National Farm to School Month. Provide NJDA School Nutrition staff with documentation, including pictures (with signed releases), flyers, menus, copies of web postings, etc.
- Menu and serve at least one (1) *Jersey Fresh* item **each week**. Documentation must be provided for the product served and farm from which it was sourced.

Participation Requirements:

- During April, November and December, menu and serve at least one (1) *Jersey Fresh* items each month.
- During May and June, menu and serve at least two (2) *Jersey Fresh* item each month.
- Promote the consumption of *Jersey Fresh* produce through signage in the cafeteria and on the school menus. Promotional materials will be provided.
- Where possible, incorporate school garden produce into the menu. Promote the school's garden through recipe samplings or taste tests in the cafeteria.
- Work with school food service personnel and appropriate faculty to coordinate a nutrition lesson related to the consumption of fruits and vegetables.
- Partner with other organizations, i.e.: Parent-teacher groups, Rutgers Cooperative Extension, community farmers markets, NJ Farm to School Network, NJ School

Nutrition Association, NJ Farm Bureau, NJ Agricultural Society, etc., to assist with events and nutrition education.

• Have a school garden or be in the planning stages of implementing a school garden. Gardens can include window-sill/container gardens, raised beds, greenhouse, courtyard/outdoor classrooms.

II. SELECTION OF SCHOOLS

- Schools must administer, in good standing, the National School Lunch Program.
- Submit a complete application packet with required documents.
- Submit a certification of support from each school, signed by the school food service director, and the administrator (i.e.: Business Administrator, Executive Director, etc. as designated in SNEARS) responsible for the program.

III. PROGRAM TIMELINE

• October 2015

•	May 1, 2015	Application packets are due.	
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- June 1, 2015 Selected schools to be notified and a list of farmers will be provided to schools.
 June/July/August Plan and begin communications with farmers as
 - described in Participation Requirements.
- August 1, 2015 Promotional materials will be mailed to schools.
- September 21 25, 2015 Conduct *Jersey Fresh* Farm to School Week activities.
 - Conduct National Farm to School Month activities.
- November 30, 2015
 Submit required documentation to NJDA School Nutrition staff.

IV. APPLICATION REVIEW AND SCORING CRITERIA

- A committee of representatives from the New Jersey Department of Agriculture will review applications.
- LEAs can apply for entire district participation or school-specific participation.

The NJ Department of Agriculture's Jersey Fresh Farm to School Recognition Program application packets must be <u>postmarked</u> by <u>May 1, 2015</u> and sent to the address below. FAXED APPLICATION PACKETS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
