On the last AR, the SFA did not have a variety of milk available either, therefore this is a repeat Performance Standard 2 (PS2) violation and all 71 breakfasts are disallowed.					
	20 lunch meals (Saturday/Sunday) served during the review week (February 17-18, 2023) did not have a milk choice. On the last AR, the SFA did not have a variety of milk available either, therefore this is a repeat Performance Standard 2 (PS2) violation and the 20 breakfasts served on the weekend are disallowed.					
	As stated above, these are repeat PS2 violations. Failure to fix identified issues will again lead to fiscal action/repeat violations in subsequent reviews.
