How Provided				Comments	On May 4, 2020, Governor Murphy signed the Hunger Free Students' of Rights Act into law. The law prevents the public identification or stigmatization of any student with school meal debt. Examples of stigmatizing, or "lunch shaming", specified in the law include requirin student to sit at a separate table, wear a wristband, handstamp, or other marker, or by serving the student an alternate meal. In additio prevents school districts from discarding a school breakfast or lunch because money is owed for previously provided meals. The law also outlines the measures schools must take in communicating with the parents and guardians of students with foodservice debt prior to the denial of a meal, if applicable, and clarifies that schools are not requi to deny a meal to students who have accumulated debt.
