National 811 Day Reminds New Jersey Residents to Be Mindful of Where They Dig

TRENTON— In recognition of August 11 as National 811 Day, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities (NJBPU) is encouraging residents to call 811 before you excavate to ensure there are no underground utilities present.

National 811 Day is part of a year-round awareness initiative to encourage businesses and residents to take all precautions before any excavation in order to avoid damaging underground utilities, interruption of vital services, property damage, and even possible injury.

"It is extremely important that those planning to excavate call 811 before they dig to protect infrastructure, and to prevent potential serious injuries," said NJBPU President Joseph Fiordaliso. "811 Day serves as a convenient reminder to always call before digging."

National 811 Day is an annual initiative led by the U.S. Department of Transportation's Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration and is supported by the NJBPU and stakeholder groups across the country to ensure the practice of safe digging to protect underground infrastructure.

The NJBPU has direct oversight of the New Jersey One Call Center, which receives more than 700,000 calls per year resulting in over 3 million "mark outs." A "mark out" is when a trained professional places flags or other symbols on the ground to show the location of an underground facility. Excavations are the leading cause of underground infrastructure damage.

In addition to calling 811, residents can call (800) 272-1000 or submit an online request at www.nj1-call.com.

If you think you might have to dig, even on your own property, make sure you follow these steps:

- Call 811 at least three business days before each project to have underground pipes, wires, and all other utilities located.
- Follow the rules outlined in N.J.A.C. 14:2 in order to plan your excavation to avoid damage and interference with underground facilities.
- Use National 811 Day as a reminder to always call 811 before digging. It's the law!
