Overview:
<p>After Hurricane Sandy, areas of direct impact of the storm were reviewed with respect to the services available in the area. Through geo-mapping it was determined that the Bayshore area was without a family success center in that area and further determinations were made that there was a risk to the health and welfare of clients in that area. The County Human Services Advisory Council member was part of the process to identify a lead agency that could provide family success services quickly to avert and ameliorate the effects of child abuse and domestic violence in this area. The agency needed to have in place a strong infrastructure, a community presence and the ability to refer and/or serve mental health and domestic violence clients.</p>
Federal Department of Origin:
<p>U.S. Dept. of Health and Human Services, Administration for Children and Families, Office of Community Services – The Disaster Relief Appropriations Act, 2013, (P. L. 113-2); “Hurricane Sandy Supplemental Funds” to address necessary expenses resulting from Hurricane Sandy, including social, health, and mental health services for individuals, and for repair, renovation and rebuilding of health care facilities (including mental health facilities), child care facilities, and other social services facilities.</p>
Federal Requirements / Restrictions:
<p>Funds to be totally expended by September 30, 2015. Also subject to Integrity Oversight monitoring via Assembly Bill A60 (A-60)(P.L.2013,c.37). Additional State regulations related to Governor Christie's Executive Order 125, as well as all applicable federal and state regulations for Procurement and Grants Management</p>
Selection Standards:
<p>This was an emergency procurement due to the severity of the impact of Superstorm Sandy. The Community YMCA was identified by the County Human Services Advisory Council member Charles Brown as the agency that could plan and develop a family success center quickly to address the services in the Bayshore Area.</p>
Eligibility Standards:

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All residents of the county are eligible for services in this highly impacted area
