Overview:
In the aftermath of Sandy, there is a need for enhanced surveillance of mosquito-borne diseases and an anticipated need for tracking high lead levels in the community during clean up, to that end, data systems need to be enhanced to support the increase in surveillance activities. NJDOH intends to utilize Communicable Disease Reporting and Surveillance System (CDRSS), which provides a well-established and familiar mechanism for reporting and case management by all the public health stakeholders in New Jersey.

Funds to be totally expended by September 30, 2015. Also subject to Integrity Oversight monitoring via Assembly Bill A60 (A-60)(P.L.2013,c.37). Selection Standards:
Services will be provided through a waiver request to expand current capabilities within the Communicable Disease Reporting and Surveillance System (CDRSS), which is currently in use by all Local Health Department and New Jersey Department of Health staff.
Eligibility Standards:
Existing vendors will be utilized to expand capabilities of the Communicable Disease Reporting and Surveillance System (CDRSS) online surveillance system via a waiver request.
