## UNIFORM FIRE CODE REGISTRY FOURTH QUARTER – OCTOBER 2013

The Registry reflects changes in the Local Enforcing Agencies (LEAs) responsible for enforcing the Uniform Fire Code within the State of New Jersey as required under (N.J.A.C.5:70-1 et seq.) as of as of October 1, 2013.

During the year 2013, we will publish three cumulative updates to this Registry consisting solely of changes. Although local jurisdiction is not effective until publication of an Annual or Quarterly Registry, we may assume jurisdiction at any time. Therefore, if jurisdiction is of concern, please call (609) 633-7129 for confirmation.

The next deadline for changes to the Registry is December 31, 2013. After that date, the Annual LEA Registry will be published in January 2014.
