Summary

In communication with Mr. Capabianco regarding the Neighborhood and Community Revitalization (NCR) application, NCR39505, for the improvements to Lakeview Field in Little Ferry Borough, several questions were asked in order to complete the environmental review required. First, Mr. Capabianco stated that all structures were built onsite approximately 30 years ago. He also confirmed that the only structures to be replaced with the 6'X17' structures would be the smaller dugouts surrounding the fields. None of the larger buildings would be touched. Second, Mr. Capabianco stated that the "t-ball" aged children (6 years and older) were only onsite twice per week for practices usually lasting one to two hours as well as one game per week also lasting one to two hours resulting in two to six hours at the site per week for children 6 years old.
