## MEMORANDUM OF RECORD CONCERNING SECTION 106 NOTIFICATION COMMENTS

On <u>April 1</u>, 2014, on behalf of Donna Mahon, Director of the NJ Department of Environmental Protection's Sandy Recovery Environmental and Historic Preservation Review Program, I notified the below identified property owner in <u>Montclair</u> by e-mail or letter, and the Mayor of Montclair through email that the their properties which are eligible for HUD funding under the Neighborhood Enhancement Program (NEP) are potentially eligible as historic properties or there is a Known Adverse Effect as concurred by the Deputy State Historic Preservation Office.

This notification was to satisfy the 15-day comment period requirement of the Programmatic Agreement among FEMA, New Jersey State Historic Preservation Office, the New Jersey Office of Emergency Management, and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation, the absentee Shawnee Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma, the Delaware Nation, the Delaware Tribe of Indians, the Shawnee Tribe of Indians of Oklahoma, and the Stockbridge Munsee Band of Mohicans. Specifically, the municipalities and other interested parties, the homeowners, were provided the opportunity to comment on the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection's proposal and concurrence by the Deputy State Historic Preservation Officer to treat the properties identified on the above-referenced spreadsheet as eligible as historic; assume an adverse effect and proceed to mitigation.

That comment period closed on <u>April 16</u>, 2014. I have received no opposing comments from the homeowners or the Mayor concerning the proposed treatment regarding the proposed Treatment Standard that I proposed to the Deputy State Historic Preservation Officer on <u>March 25</u>, 2014 and whose concurrence with that proposed treatment was accepted on <u>March 25</u>, 2014.
