Per 24 CFR 58.33, and 24 CFR 55.20(b)(1), the combined Notice of Finding of No Significant Impact and Notice of Intent to Request Release of Funds (FONSI/NOI-RROF), and the Notice and Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain will be published simultaneously with the submission of the RROF. The funds are needed on an emergency basis due to a declared disaster from the impacts of Superstorm Sandy, which made landfall on October 29, 2012. As a result, the comment periods for the FONSI/NOI-RROF and RROF have been combined. REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS On or about April 26, 2014, the DCA will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Federal funds under the Community Development Block Grant Program (CDBG) pursuant to the Disaster Relief (DR) Appropriations Act of 2013 (Public Law 113-2, approved January 29, 2013) for the Flood Hazard Risk Reduction Program (FHRRP) as proposed in the Action Plan Amendment Number 7, Substantial Amendment for the Second Allocation of CDBG-DR Funds. DCA expects to fund roughly \$5,000,000 of this approximately \$24,000,000-project from the FHRRP funds. The following information pertains to this project: Project Title: Route 35 Sheeting Project Location: Route 35 from Milepost 7.24 to Milepost 10.7, Borough of Mantoloking, Township of Brick Estimated Cost: \$5,000,000 Project Description The proposed project is to protect the New Jersey Route 35 (NJ 35) roadway from future damage of breach as was experienced during Superstorm Sandy. It involves the placement of a continuous 3.5-mile wall of steel sheeting parallel to NJ 35 within the Borough of Mantoloking and Township of Brick in Ocean County. The steel sheeting would provide additional protection from future coastal flooding of the federal/state investment in the reconstruction of Route 35, a major traffic artery and coastal evacuation route. The purpose of the FHRRPF program is to protect public and private property and infrastructure from coastal storm damage, erosion and shoreline migration, and sea-level rise. Projects include flood risk reduction measures or improvements, including through property or easement acquisition, demolition, site preparation for Army Corps of Engineer projects, and infrastructure construction, installation or repair. NOTICE AND PUBLIC EXPLANATION OF A PROPOSED ACTIVITY IN A 100-YEAR FLOODPLAIN This is to give notice that the DCA has conducted an evaluation as required by

Executive Order 11988, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management and Wetlands Protection. The activity is funded under the Flood Hazard Risk Reduction Program. The proposed project is to protect Route 35 from future damage of breach as was experienced during Superstorm Sandy. It involves the placement of a continuous 3.5-mile wall of steel sheeting parallel to New Jersey Route 35 within the Borough of Mantoloking and Township of Brick in Ocean County. The steel sheeting would be placed along the beach. A subsequent U.S. Army Corps of Engineers beachfill project would cover the sheeting with sand and the sheeting would be enveloped into the dune system and form a barrier to protect the Route 35 roadway from the effects of future coastal flooding. The entire project would be constructed within the Special Flood Hazard Area Zone "VE" coastal floodplain, as shown on the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) Panel 216 of 660, Map Number 34029C0216G, March 28, 2014 and Panel 218 of 660, Map Number 34029C0218G, March 28, 2014. DCA has considered the following alternatives and mitigation measures to minimize adverse impacts and to restore and preserve natural and beneficial values. Alternatives to relocate the project outside of the floodplain are not available and would be contrary to the purpose and function of the proposed improvement. Additionally, the entire stretch of Route 35 is located within the 100-year floodplain. Therefore, there is no surface alternative where the road alignment could be relocated outside of the 100-year floodplain. A No Action alternative was considered and rejected because taking no action would not address the vital infrastructure needs of the area, would not aid in community and economic recovery in Brick and Mantoloking, and would not address the needed reduction of future flood risk and associated human health, safety, and welfare impacts. Implementation of the proposed action will require local and state permits, which may place additional mitigation requirements on the project. DCA has reevaluated the alternatives to building in the floodplain and has determined that it has no practicable alternative. Environmental files that document compliance with steps 3 through 6 of Executive Order 11988 are available for public inspection, review and copying upon request at the times and location delineated in the last paragraph of this notice for receipt of comments. DCA has determined that construction and operation of the proposed project would not result in significant adverse impacts to flood levels, flood risk, or the flow of floodwaters in the project or surrounding areas. The project would reduce flood level, flood risk, and the flow of floodwaters onto the project area. Therefore, the proposed project would be compliant with the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 (44 CFR § 59) and EO 11988 on Floodplain Management (42 FR 26951).

**FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT** An Environmental Assessment has been prepared and DCA has determined that this project will have no significant impact on the human environment; therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. The reason for the decision not to prepare an EIS is that no significant impacts or hazards were identified in the course of the environmental review.
