

## BB SAMP Meeting Summary 3/17/11

Questions asked by Tom Micai to kick off informal discussion about the elements and process to develop a SAMP:

1. What should the process be for the SAMP?
2. What is the goal and indicators that will measure success?
3. Who are the players?

Elements to be included in the SAMP as suggested by the invitees:

- Streamline permitting
- Require Best management practises - Get the best practices from existing rules and make them consistent across the region
- Establish a new coastal boundary - Sub CAFRA---/WQMP/lack of best management practises/link standards; Coastal and watershed planning for BB
- TMDL—load allocations tie into the Wastewater Management Plans and land use development
- Use existing DEP regulations to implement better landuse regulations
- Sustainable Jersey-stormwater
- Line up state regulatory processes to achieve coordination and consistency and reduce the number of planning entities doing the same reviews; Obtain a commitment from county and mayors - create Interagency agreements
- Need to implement land use practices that reduce nutrient loads to the Bay
- Need to look at both new and existing development
- Upgrade failing septics—get an accurate inventory in the county
- The plan needs to limit sprawl
- Provide clear and consistent standards to address the environmentally correct way to develop
- Wants the SAMP to be mandatory
- Develop ordinances similar to the Meadowlands that all municipalities must use
