Meeting Record

Roll call was taken. Chairman called for motion to approve the September minutes. Irwin Zonis moved to approve the September minutes with minor edits. James Blando seconded the motion. Jorge Berkowitz and Joyce Paul abstained. The September minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.

Chris Archer welcomed the Council to McGuire AFB, which is an Air Force Model Energy Base, as Mr. Archer would explain later in the morning.

Administrative Report

Presented by Bill O’Sullivan, Director, Division of Air Quality:

NOTE: NJDEP and McGuire AFB have a good relationship. It is a major facility with Title V permits.

1. Electricity Generation—PPL Distributed Generation received final permit approval on

- September 9, to construct a 4.8 megawatt landfill gas-to-energy facility in Deerfield Township in Cumberland County.
2. Connective Atlantic Generation—Environmental Improvement Pilot Test (EIPT) approved to assess feasibility of injecting hydrated lime to reduce/control Hydrochloric acid (HCL) emissions at its coal-fired unit at the Deepwater Generating Station in Pennsville. Recent tests indicate that HCL emissions exceed the permitted maximum allowable.
 3. RC Cape May—An application for an EIPT was also submitted for the BL England Generating Station in Cape May to assess the operational feasibility of burning a mixture of western and eastern coals in Unit 2.
 4. State Implementation Plan (SIP)—Hearings were held on the SIP revision proposal for Attainment of the PM 2.5 Annual National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) on August 8 and on Regional Haze on October 27. Comment period for Haze SIP closes November 28.
 5. Vandalism forces Closing of Camden Air Monitoring System—For safety and security reasons the Air Monitoring station at Copewood and David Streets in Camden was shut down on September 29. The station is located in the former Institute for Medical Research property, which is now vacant. This station has been in operation for approximately 40 years, one of the oldest and continuous air monitoring stations in New Jersey.

Energy and Clean Air Program Initiatives

- Chairman called for motion to adjourn the meeting. Jorge Berkowitz made the motion to adjourn, seconded by Joseph Spatola. The meeting was adjourned at 12:17 p.m.
