Meeting Record

Roll call was taken. Chairman called for motion to approve the January minutes. Ken Thoman made the motion to approve January minutes. Pam Mount seconded the motion. The January minutes were approved by a unanimous vote.

Administrative Report

Presented by Chris Salmi, Assistant Director, Air Quality Management:

- Meeting New Jersey's 2020 Greenhouse Gas Limit: New Jersey's Global Warming Response Act Recommendations Report is posted at http://www.nj.gov/globalwarming/home/gwra_report.html. The core measures are: the Regional Greenhouse Initiative (RGGI), the Energy Master Plan and the Low Emission Vehicle Program remain the same.
- USEPA promulgated a new primary National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for nitrogen dioxide (NO₂) of 100 ppb maximum daily 1-hour average.

USEPA also established new monitoring requirements for NO₂ near major roads, in large urban areas, and in communities that are susceptible and vulnerable to NO₂-related health effects. Designation of attainment or nonattainment areas is expected by January, 2011 and operational roadway monitoring sites are required to be in place by January, 2013.

- The diesel idling sleeper berth exemption takes effect May 1, 2010. As of this date, trucks with sleeper berths will no longer be permitted to idle. Based on discussions with NJDOT and State Police, there are no safety concerns with implementation of this regulation. Three primary alternatives to idling are: truck stop electrification; onboard auxiliary power systems and bunk heaters; and diesel particulate filters.
- Centralized Inspection Facilities (CIFs) have begun converting to the new inspection system. To date, conversions were completed at CIFs in Washington, South Brunswick, Lakewood, Southampton, and Delanco. The plan includes converting all CIFs in New Jersey by end of next month. - PurGen applied for a permit to operate a 750 megawatt integrated gasification combined cycle facility. The facility will export up to 450 MW of electrical power to the PJM Interconnection market. The facility would capture 90% of the carbon dioxide emissions which would be sequestered approximately 70 miles off-shore.
