

## Environmental Laboratory Advisory Committee (ELAC) Meeting Minutes: October 12<sup>th</sup>, 2017

## Administrative Business:

The meeting was called to order at 9:30am by the ELAC Chair, Dorothy Love (Eurofins). Meeting minutes were taken by Nick Straccione (EMSL Analytical, Inc.), ELAC secretary.

The September 2017 ELAC Meeting Minutes were approved with a motion by Charles Anzolut (Agra) and seconded by Rose Koplin (Accred. Analytical).

Environmental Laboratory Certification Program (ELCP): Deb Waller (NJDEP-OQA) provided an update.

The comment period has closed for the revisions made to NJAC 8:26, Recreational Bathing regulation. It includes swimming pools, spas, freshwater bathing areas, etc. Two of the changes made were: the total coliforms hold time change from 30 to 8 hours and E. coli testing from 6 to 8 hours. This regulation is scheduled to be in place by the next bathing season.

NJDEP OQA will be removing the certs for the individual metals procedures (with the exception of mercury) at the same time that the other SW846 methods will be removed, effective July 1, 2018. These metals will now reference SW846 7000B only.

A summary of the new MDL procedure was provided at the meeting and the full procedure can be found via the link provided below. This link can aid laboratories in determining the signal to noise ratio when running GC/MS. In addition, there are some new methods listed in the new MUR, 624.1, 625.1, 608.3, new HACH methods and Timberline ammonia.

As of October 1, 2017 the OQA will be enforcing the requirements noted in NJAC 7:18-2.5 for all future initial certification/modification requests received after that date. Any modification applications for any initial certification must include all required documentation necessary for review before the application will even be processed.

Division of Water Supply/Safe Drinking Water: Linda Bonnette (NJDEP BSDW). No update

The BSDW is working on an SOP on how positive results are invalidated. Included in that SOP will be a checklist that will detail the relevant information needed to validate the data. Only BDSW can invalidate positive results but labs may invalidate negative samples due to batch QC issues. If re-sampling is required the clients must be contact immediately to obtain a new sample within 24 hours or notify NJDEP if outside 24 hours.
