January is National Radon Action Month. ## Start Your New Year Off Right; Conduct A National Radon Action Month Activity Or Event

Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that you can't see, taste, or smell. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States resulting in approximately 20,000 deaths annually. There is no truly "safe" level of radon; however the risk decreases as the radon concentration decreases. The only way to know if you have high levels of radon is to test. Testing is easy and inexpensive and high levels of radon can be fixed.

The Radon Leaders Saving Lives portal connects radon stakeholders through interactive tools and resources to help facilitate action and radon risk reduction.

During NRAM 2013 (activities with start dates from October 2012 through February 2013); a total of 2,848 activities and events were conducted by stakeholders in communities across the country.
