## **BACKGROUND**

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) and the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) and other federal laws require that districts provide programs and services based on the requirements specified in each of the authorizing statutes (i.e., ESEA, IDEA, and Carl D. Perkins). The laws further require that state education agencies such as the New Jersey Department of Education (NJDOE) monitor the implementation of federal programs by sub recipients and determine whether the funds are being used by the district for their intended purpose and achieving the overall objectives of the funding initiatives. Due to the impending implementation of new ESSA regulations, only IDEA will be reviewed during consolidated monitoring.

## **INTRODUCTION**

The NJDOE visited the Middle Township Public Schools to monitor the district's use of federal funds and the related program plans, where applicable, to determine whether the district's programs were meeting the intended purposes and objectives, as specified in the current year grant application and authorizing statutes, and to determine whether the funds were spent in accordance with the program requirements, federal and state laws, and applicable regulations. The on-site visit included a review of documentation for IDEA Basic for the period July 1, 2015 through November 1, 2016.

The scope of work performed included the review of documentation including grant applications, program plans and needs assessments, grant awards, annual audits, board minutes, payroll records, accounting records, purchase orders, and an interview of the program administrator regarding the IDEA grant, as well as current district policies and procedures. The monitoring team members also conducted interviews with school personnel, reviewed documentation for a sample of expenditures and conducted internal control reviews.

#### **EXPENDITURES REVIEWED**

The IDEA Basic and Preschool grant was reviewed from July 1, 2015 through November 1, 2016. A sampling of purchase orders and/or salaries was taken from each program reviewed.

#### GENERAL OVERVIEW OF USES OF IDEA FUNDS

## **IDEA Projects (Special Education)**

The FY 2016-2017 IDEA Basic and Preschool funds are being used to reduce district tuition costs for students receiving special educational services in other public school districts and approved private schools for students with disabilities. Additionally, Coordinated Early Intervening Services funds are used to fund the salary and benefits of a part time Basic Skills elementary school teacher to support identified students.

Nonpublic funds are used to provide supplemental support to classified students attending nonpublic schools.

## **IDEA (Special Education)**

A review of the expenditures charged to the IDEA grant yielded no findings.
