## **SYNOPSIS**

Petitioning parent challenged the Board's residency determination that S.B., IV, V.B. and L.L. were not domiciled in the District. The Board counterclaimed for tuition.

In light of testimony of the parties involved, the ALJ determined that S.B., III, had custody of the children and that since he was domiciled within the Union Township school district, the children were entitled to attend the District's public schools free of charge. The ALJ reversed the Board's determination denying domicile eligibility to the children and ordered the children be permitted to attend the Union Township public schools.

The Commissioner adopted the findings and determination in the Initial Decision as his own.
