SYNOPSIS

The District reduced petitioner from a 4/5<sup>th</sup> position as a school social worker to a 1/5<sup>th</sup> position beginning in the 2002-03 school year. Petitioner sought enforcement of her tenure and seniority rights and appointment to a 4/5<sup>th</sup> position as a social worker or other position under her educational services certification.

The ALJ determined that the District's decision to adjust the Child Study Team's workload was made in good faith and promoted economy and efficiency. The ALJ concluded that petitioner's tenure rights were not infringed. Petition was dismissed.

The Commissioner adopted the Initial Decision as his own.
