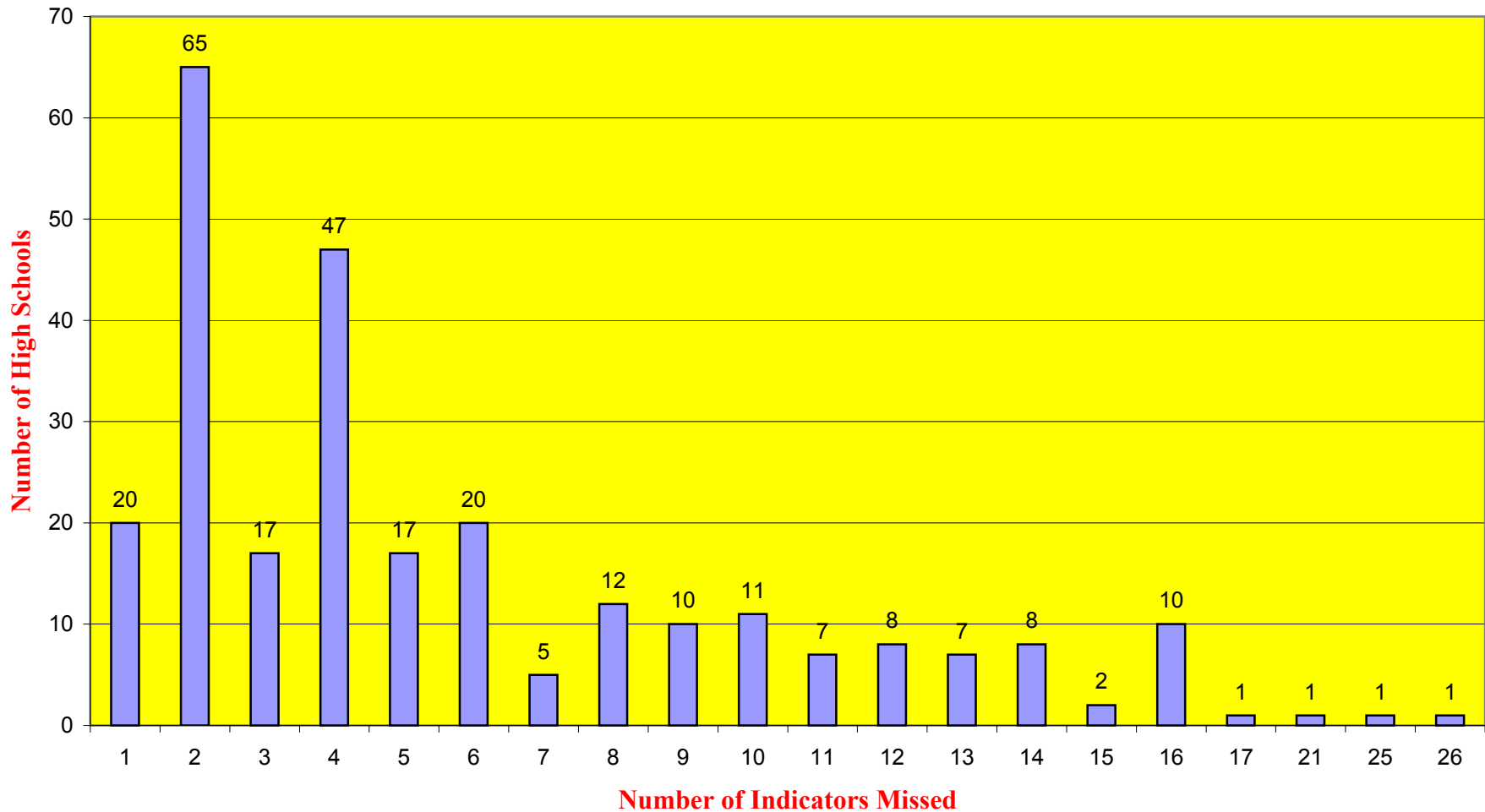

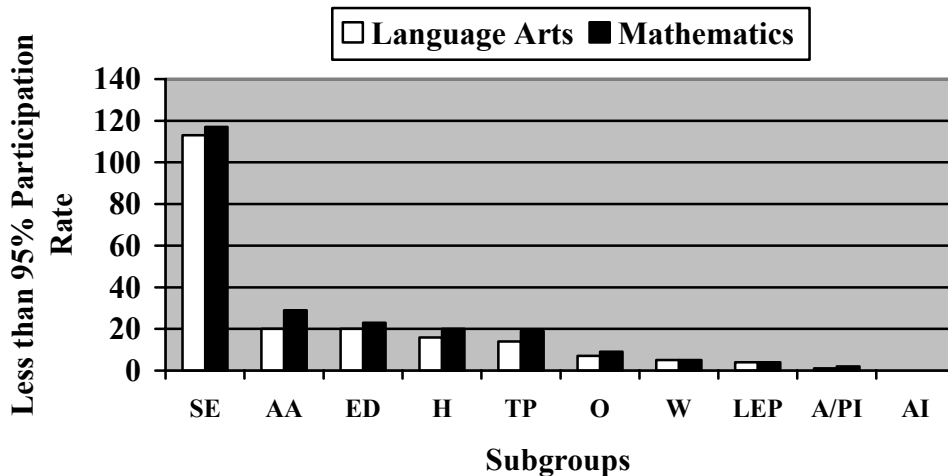
**EARLY WARNING STATUS UNDER THE NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND

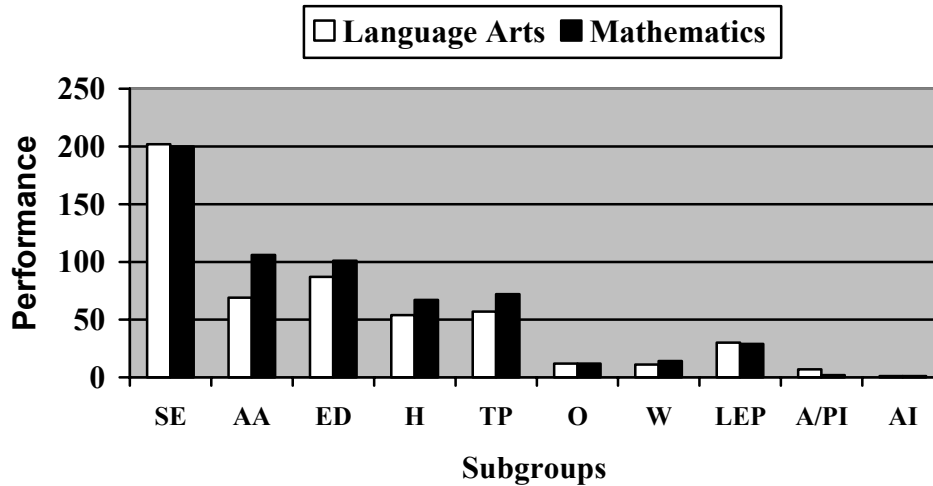

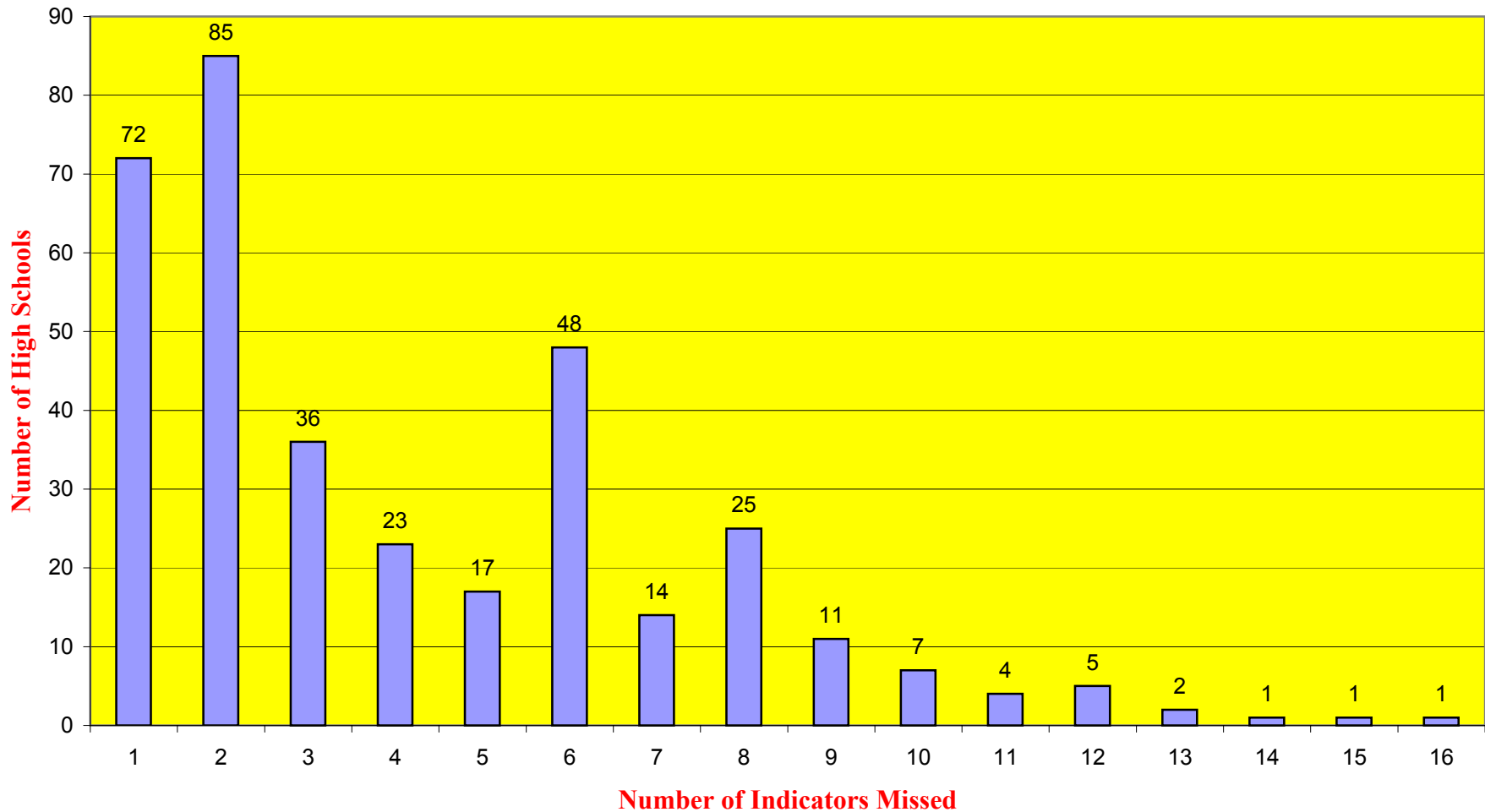

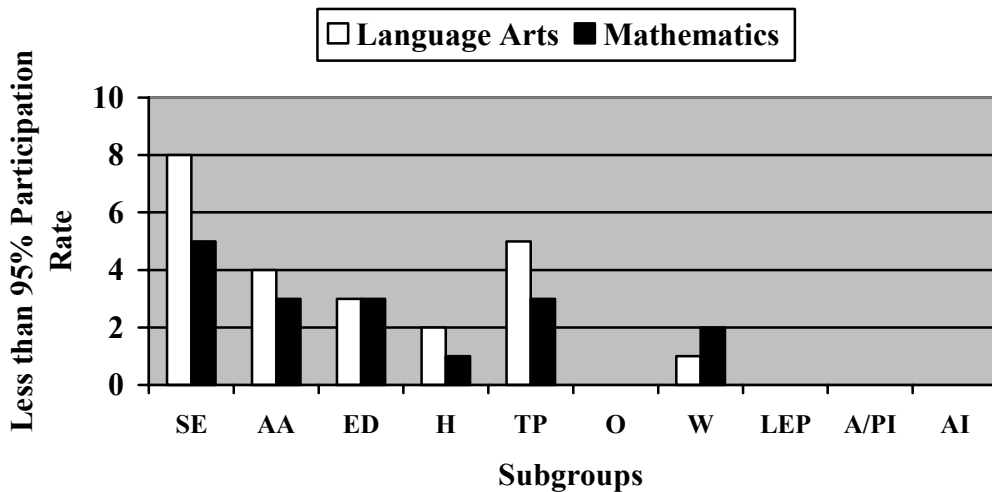

## **Transition from IASA to NCLB – New Jersey**

### **2002 – 2003 School Year (Elementary & Middle Schools only)**

- 259 schools in need of improvement under IASA – required to offer choice option

### **2003 – 2004 School Year**

#### ***Under IASA (Elementary & Middle Schools only):***

- 214 schools in need of improvement – 2nd consecutive year – offer choice & SES
- 36 schools made AYP for 1 year – continue offering choice option
- 9 schools met state standards – no longer identified as schools in need of improvement

#### ***Under NCLB (all schools):***

- HSPA
  - 271 high schools placed in “early warning status” based upon 2003 HSPA test results (*no sanctions for 2003-04 school year*)
- GEPA
  - 6 new schools (elementary or middle) have been identified as in need of improvement based upon the 2003 GEPA test results - *will be required to offer choice option for the 2003-04 school year*
  - 101 schools previously identified as in need of improvement for a third year (*corrective action will be required*)\*
  - 260 schools placed in “early warning status” based upon the 2003 GEPA test results (*no sanctions for 2003-04 school year*)
- NJASK 4
  - Possibly 14 new elementary schools will be identified as in need of improvement based upon the 2003 NJASK 4 test results - *will be required to offer choice option for the 2003-04 school year*

- There are 173 elementary schools that may move into their third year of improvement status pending the analysis of the 2003 NJ ASK 4 results (*these schools will move into corrective action*) \*
- Unknown number of elementary schools will be placed in “early warning status” pending analysis of the 2003 NJASK 4 results (*no sanctions for 2003-04 school year*)

\*Some of these schools house both grades 4 and 8, therefore these numbers may represent a duplicated count.
