CONVENING

State Board of Education President Mark Biedron convened the public meeting with the reading of the statement pertaining to the public session of the State Board meeting as it complies with the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act.

COMMISSIONER'S REPORTS

NJ Tiered System of Supports Presentation

Susan Martz, Assistant Commissioner/Chief Learning Supports and Specialized Services Officer, Division of Learning Supports and Specialized Services, Margaret McDonald, Deputy Chief Learning Supports and Specialized Services Officer, David Cittadino, Superintendent Old Bridge Public Schools and Caitlin Colandrea, Supervisor of Intervention Services, Old Bridge Public Schools provided an overview of New Jersey's Tiered System of Supports.

New Jersey Tiered System of Supports (NJTSS) is a multi-tiered framework for delivering instruction, academic and behavioral supports and interventions, and enrichment in a coordinated manner.

NJTSS includes the three-tiered approach to instruction, assessment and intervention found in many models of response to intervention, along with three foundational components: effective district and school leadership, positive school culture and climate, and family and community engagement. Together, these components create an efficient and effective mechanism for schools to improve achievement for all students. NJTSS builds on effective practices and initiatives already in place in schools, and maximizes the efficient use of resources to improve support for all classroom teachers and target interventions to students based on their needs.

Recently, the NJDOE, in partnership with Rutgers University, was awarded a \$6,146,922 grant from the Office of Special Education Programs, United States Department of Education, to provide intensive coaching in 60 districts to implement NJTSS for early reading.

The New Jersey Department of Education staff will be working closely with faculty from Rutgers University, co-developers of the grant, to coach educators from three groups of 20 districts each over a five-year period. The New Jersey Principals and Supervisors Association (NJPSA) will work with

principals on leadership support for NJTSS and the State Parent Advocacy Network (SPAN) will engage educators and families in a process to enhance family involvement. The Dumont School District, which is currently implementing a tiered system of support, will also work with the project and provide the practitioner view point as NJTSS is rolled out.

New Jersey's grant will commence on October 1, 2016. Information regarding the process for applying to participate in grant activities will be disseminated later this fall.

National Superintendent of the Year for the National Association of School Superintendents-Dr. Timothy Purnell, Superintendent of the Somerville School District

Dr. Timothy Purnell, Superintendent of the Somerville School District provided an overview of the work currently underway in his school district. His presentation highlighted, among other things, strong parent-community connections, a student centered culture, shared leadership, recognition programs and best practices.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE 2015-2020 NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF STATE DIRECTORS OF TEACHER EDUCATION AND CERTIFICATION (NASDTEC) INTERSTATE AGREEMENT FOR EDUCATOR LICENSURE

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 18A:26-11 *et seq.* recognizes the importance of interstate agreements concerning educational programs and personnel, and N.J.S.A. 18A:26-14 authorizes the Secretary of the Board of Examiners to enter into contracts on behalf of the State with one or more other states for the acceptance of educational personnel, and N.J.S.A. 18A:26-21 requires the specific terms of the contracts to be approved by the New Jersey State Board of Education upon recommendation by the Commissioner and State Board of Examiners; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey State Board of Education has authorized prior NASDTEC interstate agreements in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:26-14 and N.J.S.A. 18A:26-21; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner and State Board of Examiners recommend that the New Jersey State Board of Education approve the 2015-2020 NASDTEC Interstate Agreement for Educator Licensure; and now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the New Jersey State Board of Education approves the 2015-2020 NASDTEC Interstate Agreement for Educator Licensure and authorizes the Secretary of the State Board of Examiners to sign the Agreement on behalf of the New Jersey Department of Education.

F. ESEA Unsafe School Choice Option

• Discussed the following resolution to revise the Unsafe School Choice Option (USCO) Policy, pursuant to The *Elementary and Secondary Education Act* (Act) of 1965 SEC. 8532, as reauthorized under the *Every Student Succeeds Act* of 2015.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING REVISIONS TO THE UNSAFE SCHOOL CHOICE OPTION POLICY

WHEREAS, The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (Act) of 1965 SEC. 8532, as reauthorized under the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015, sets forth that each state receiving funds under this Act shall establish and implement a statewide policy requiring that a student attending a persistently dangerous public elementary school or secondary school, while in or on the grounds of a public elementary school or secondary school that the student attends, be allowed to attend a safe public elementary school or secondary school within the local educational agency, including a public charter school: and

WHEREAS, to improve student achievement, our schools must provide safe, nurturing environments where students can learn and are valued and respected; and

WHEREAS, the focus of the Unsafe School Choice Option provision of the Act is on working with schools proactively to identify those schools at risk of being labeled persistently dangerous and offer them technical assistance to improve school safety; and

WHEREAS, only minor revisions have been incorporated into the Unsafe School Choice Option policy in New Jersey since its initial approval by the State Board of Education on June 18, 2003; and

WHEREAS, the policy has been revised in accordance with the law to ensure that the criteria used continue to accurately reflect school safety in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Education recommends that the New Jersey State Board of Education approve the revised Unsafe School Choice Option policy for New Jersey; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the New Jersey State Board of Education approves the revised Unsafe School Choice Option policy; and be it further

RESOLVED that district boards of education shall fully comply with implementation with the 2016-2017 school year.

G. Fiscal Accountability, Efficiency and Budgeting Procedures
