Except for those pipelines that are needed to transport natural gas directly to customers, adding new, large pipelines that require excavating wetlands and other essential parts of our state ecology is an unwise thing to do over the long term, as doing so will likely cause irreparable damage to the land, and other environmentally harmful effects (such as encouraging the burning of fossil fuels that contribute carbon dioxide, carbon monoxide, and, of course, methane, all greenhouse gases, to the atmosphere). The damage to environmentally sensitive and ecologically necessary lands will have repercussions long after the natural gas has been tapped out or replaced by renewable energy sources, because it will likely be impossible to restore these lands to even close to their pristine state. In other words, building natural gas pipelines will likely lead to a permanent loss for the residents of the state, in exchange for only a temporary gain. Please recognize the wisdom of excluding the addition of natural gas pipelines from the Energy Master Plan. Thank you.

The second line was installed a few years ago. they tunneled under my yard so there was little immediate disruption but the rest of the area was not as fortunate. They tore out a 250 foot swath of forest that will never grow back in several lifetimes. The original right of way was 100 feet. to add insult to injury they never used any of the extra 150 foot swath during construction. There were several ponds affected by runoff. They sold the timber and when they left planted seedlings in the soil that was stripped of any nutrients and left them to wither. They replanted the following year after town took legal action and put the seedlings in plastic tubes where they withered and died again. I live in a lightly populated area of the state. To even consider putting these new lines in heavily populated areas is insanity. In the winter I have seen round holes melted through a foot of snow directly above the pipes indicating gas leaks, not the general melting from the heated pipe.

NJ has already witnessed the death and destruction of a pipeline explosion, just because I'm sitting on one now doesn't mean more lives should be put at risk and our dwindling pristine (Pine Barons, Delaware Water Gap) areas need to remain pristine
