to add insult to injury they never used any of the extra 150 foot swath during construction. There were several ponds affected by runoff. They sold the timber and when they left planted seedlings in the soil that was stripped of any nutrients and left them to wither. They replanted the following year after town took legal action and put the seedlings in plastic tubes where they withered and died again. I live in a lightly populated area of the state. To even consider putting these new lines in heavily populated areas is insanity. In the winter I have seen round holes melted through a foot of snow directly above the pipes indicating gas leaks, not the general melting from the heated pipe.

NJ has already witnessed the death and destruction of a pipeline explosion, just because I'm sitting on one now doesn't mean more lives should be put at risk and our dwindling pristine (Pine Barons, Delaware Water Gap) areas need to remain pristine
