

She left the BPU and is now back with her old law firm, McCarter & English, who, by the way, happens to represent KDC Solar. See a problem here?

You may have a hard time convincing your commissioners to agree with you on the subject of not placing solar panels on open-space and farmland. Upendra Chivukula has been on KDC's payroll to the tune of almost \$10,000. Ask him what bills he sponsored, as Assemblyman, to benefit KDC. Ask him also, how he even thought of his bill, it is so obscure, but very beneficial to KDC. No one simply would ever think of this, but somehow, he did.

Yes, your job will get much tougher.
