Furthermore, the proposed 30 inch diameter gas transmittal pipeline poses a serious threat to homes, churches, schools, businesses, and residents along the route. The pipeline will pass within 140 feet of my home! A similar 30 inch gas pipeline blew up in San Bruno, California. It leveled 35 houses, killed eight people, and injured 58. The explosion sent a sheet of flame a thousand feet into the air and created a crater 167 feet in length and 26 feet wide. Homes 800 feet way are threatened.

Large transmission gas pipelines have no odor added, so a leak may not be detected. Natural gas is a simple asphyxiate - if you walk near a leak you could be killed. The valve sites could be hit by a car or truck.

Regarding impact on home value, 68% of the people surveyed believe a large diameter pipeline will reduce the value of a home. 70% believe it will take longer to sell a home with a nearby large transmission gas pipeline. 58.9 percent of those surveyed indicated they would not buy a house at any price with a nearby large transmission gas pipeline!
