Captain Joel S. Fogel

was born and raised near Atlantic City, NJ. He developed an insatiable interest in the sea as a young man working aboard his grandfather's commercial fishing vessel, the Blue Fish. It is on these first adventures that he quickly learned how pollution and environmental factors can affect the sea life as well as humanity and thus started his lifelong quest to protect it.

In 1973, in cooperation with the Smithsonian Institute and carrying the Explorers Club flag for the first time, Joel Fogel began the Omo River Tribal Survey Expedition in Ethiopia. Traveling by raft, he surveyed the various known tribes who lived along the River. It is on this expedition that he discovered the Stone Age Mursi tribe for the first time, which sparked much excite nent and curiosity amongst scholars worldwide. He was lived with these ancient peoples and was initiated into the tribe as "Nogolull" meaning the man who came by water. He forever left his mark in this community and has tried to protect them ever since.

In 1986, he led the Maroni River Expedition which studied the Guyana tribes in the Amazon Basin for the film documentary "Twilight of the Primitive". In 1987, carrying the flag once again, he explored by kayak the Great Bend and Triger Leap Gorges on the Yangtze River in China to site a hydro-electric plant.

He has received much recognition and many awards for his work, including the Lowell Thomas Award (2010), National Geographic's "Adventurer of the Year" (2008) and The Audubon Society's Golden Osprey award for Environmental Awareness (1993). In 2004, Joel was awarded "Explorer of the Year" by the Explorers Club Philadelphia Chapter and currently sits on the Board of Directors as Chairman of Environmental Affairs and Global Water Quality. In June of 2015 he was nominated for the Edward C. Sweeney Award for contributions made to The Explorers Club, by the Executive Director of The Explorers Club. Today, he continues to be an advocate for research, exploration and water quality worldwide.
