

## G. Antiviral Drug Distribution and Use Overview

Antiviral Drug Distribution and Use outlines NJ's management of the antiviral drugs received from the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS), including antiviral storage, division of the allotment into distribution units, and the arrangement for delivery of these units to the organizations responsible for local distribution of the drugs. In addition to federal SNS supplies, NJ Strategic State Stockpile (SSS) Program is stockpiling antiviral drugs. This section also covers:

- Requirement for LINCS agencies to establish Antiviral Drug Distribution locations
- Estimate of antiviral regimens by county, based upon availability and CDC guidance
- Reinforcement that supply requests go through the State Emergency Operations Center
- SSS resources
- Reinforcement that Federal restrictions require state governments to request supplies from the SNS
- State provision of transportation of and security for supplies from state SSS or Receipt, Storage, and Staging (RSS) warehouses
- LINCS agency responsibility for transportation of, and security for, supplies from their RSS location to specific sites
- Determinants for the use of antivirals for prophylaxis and treatment
- Detailed guidance and checklists for public Points of Dispensing for antivirals, including site selection, equipment/supplies, hours of operation, clinic flow chart, job summaries, standing orders, household intake form, pediatric dosing, recordkeeping, and site security
