1. Is the packaging clean, intact, and tamper-resistant so that the contents are adequately protected?			
2. Is all writing in common language English or is there an English translation?			
3. Is the print large enough to be easily readable?			
4. Does the statement of identity clearly identify the product in common language?			
5. Does the label indicate that the product is an herbal or dietary supplement?			
6. Is the net quantity in pounds, ounces, gallons, quarts, pints, or fluid ounces?			
7. If a medical claim is made, is it followed by a disclaimer that the FDA has not evaluated the claim?			
8. If a medical claim is made, is there a statement that the product is not intended to diagnose, treat, cure, or prevent any disease?			
9. Does the label include directions for use?			
10. Does the label include information on serving size, nutrients/vitamins, percent daily value, and other ingredients?			
11. Does the label list other ingredients in common language?			
12. Are the name and address of the manufacturer on the label?			
13. If the product is manufactured outside the US, are the name and address of the US distributor on the label?			
14. If product is questionable, has the firm given you the name(s) and address(es) of their suppliers?			
15. If product is questionable, has the firm given you the name(s) and address(es) of their buyers?
