## **GENERAL DESCRIPTION**

Under the supervision of the Executive Director of the Office of Long-Term Care Resiliency (OLTCR), this position shall coordinate, organize, and supervise staff engaged in projects within the OLTCR and will identify and monitor the Quality Assurance process to improve the mission of the Department.

This position will be tasked with collecting, analyzing and interpreting health data in order to track trends, plan appropriate interventions, measure quality, and collaborate with the supervisor to coordinate solutions. Will over-see project management to ensure standards, quality, and goals are achieved timely and will develop and procure resources to provide materials and documents to promote and organize the Department's tasks, projects, and mission towards Long-Term Care resiliency.

This position may be eligible to participate in the Department's pilot telework program, which offers eligible employees the opportunity to work remotely for up to two (2) days per week, as approved by management

# REQUIREMENTS (EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE / LICENSES)

LICENSE: A license as a Registered Nurse in the State of New Jersey.

EXPERIENCE: Five (5) years of experience in the monitoring and/or evaluation of clinical or human services records and/or programs in a hospital or other health services facility or in a human services agency.

NOTE: A Bachelor's degree, and four (4) years of experience in the monitoring and/or evaluation of clinical or human services records and/or programs in a hospital or other health services facility or in a human services agency may be substituted for the above license and experience requirements.

NOTE: A Master's degree in Public Health or a health care related field may be substituted for one (1) year of indicated experience.

LICENSE: Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.
