GENERAL DESCRIPTION				
The Grants Specialist position is responsible for the management of assigned federal and state accounts within the Department of Health and the development of methods and means to secure new funds for proposed programs. Monitors the expenditures of assigned grant programs, reviews federal grant applications, agreements and accounting documents to ensure compliance. Maintains records of assigned federal grants which contain the total federal funds to the Department and the State matching share. Responsible for internal financial review for grant agreements to project expenditures through the end of budget grant period for variance computation and assists project managers with budgetary amendments as needed. As needed, approve grant orders and supply account numbers for multiple funding sources.
