GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The Communicable Disease Service (CDS), Infectious and Zoonotic Disease Program (IZDP) is hiring a Coordinator, Veterinary Public Health, who will serve as the State Public Health Veterinarian. This position monitors the incidence and prevalence of infectious and zoonotic diseases in New Jersey, develops recommendations regarding their control, and communicates these recommendations to appropriate health care providers, public officials, and policy-makers. This position provides consultation and technical assistance to health officials, policy makers and the public regarding zoonotic diseases, animal control, bioterrorism involving a zoonotic agent, and licensed animal facilities.

The State Public Health Veterinarian also oversees the Veterinary Public Health Unit, which includes activities to prevent and control animal rabies, development, inspection, and enforcement of rules regarding licensed animal control facilities, certification of animal control officers, coordination of state-sponsored municipal rabies vaccination clinics, the state's animal population control program, and data and revenue resulting from municipal dog licensing.

This position will collaborate with other programs within the Communicable Disease Service and with other agencies within N.J. (e.g., NJDEP, NJDA, academic partners) as well as nationally to coordinate a One Health response for surveillance, prevention, investigation, and control of zoonotic diseases, outbreaks and bioterrorism threats.

Other responsibilities include preparing grant and other funding opportunity applications, reports, and budgets, monitoring expenditures, and supervising staff supporting zoonotic disease prevention and control and veterinary public health unit programs.

REQUIREMENTS (EDUCATION / EXPERIENCE / LICENSES)

EDUCATION: Graduation from an accredited school of Veterinary Medicine with a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree supplemented by a Master's degree in Public Health from an accredited college or university.

EXPERIENCE: Two (2) years of experience in the field of public health, with a federal, state, or local agency one year which shall have involved supervisory responsibilities in the field of epidemiology or in a veterinary public health program.

LICENSE: Appointee must possess or be eligible for a license as a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine issued by or as determined by the New Jersey State Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners.

Appointee will be required to possess a driver's license valid in New Jersey only if the operation of a vehicle, rather than employee mobility, is necessary to perform the essential duties of the position.
