

**PLEASE take notice** that the Division of Gaming Enforcement shall, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-69e, conduct an experiment for the purpose of determining whether single or linked progressive wagers for the authorized games of caribbean stud poker, let it ride poker, four card poker and a variation, texas hold 'em bonus poker, ultimate texas hold 'em, and mississippi stud are suitable for casino use.

The experiment will be conducted in accordance with temporary rules, which shall be available in each casino participating in the experiment, and shall also be available from the Division upon request.

The test would allow a casino licensee which wishes to participate in the experiment, and which meets all the terms and conditions established by the Division, to implement the linked progressive wagers for the authorized table games in its casino.

This experiment could begin on or after February 28, 2012, and continue for a maximum of 270 days from that date, unless otherwise terminated by the Division or any of the participating casino licensees prior to that time, pursuant to the terms and conditions of the experiments.

Some of temporary amendments are proposed under Chapter 47 of the New Jersey Administrative Code. If proposed new rules at N.J.A.C. 13:69F become effective prior to the expiration of those temporary amendments herein, these temporary rules shall be codified under N.J.A.C. 13:69F for the remainder of the 270 days allotted for the experiment.

Should the temporary amendments prove successful, in the judgment of the Division, the Division will propose them for final

adoption, in accordance with the public notice and comment requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act and N.J.A.C. 1:30.
