# ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

## MANSLAUGHTER

### Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 35 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for manslaughter during the year, a decrease of 8 percent when compared to 2006.
- Adults accounted for 94 percent and juveniles accounted for 6 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 77 percent of the arrests and females 23 percent.
- Seventy-one percent of the persons arrested were white and 26 percent were black and 3 percent were other races.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 20 percent of the arrests and 80 percent were non-Hispanic.

## SIMPLE ASSAULT

### Definition

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 27,953 simple assault arrests in 2007, representing a decrease of 4 percent when compared to 2006.
- Of the total, 17 percent were juveniles and 83 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 75 percent and females 25 percent of the persons arrested for simple assault.
- Seventy-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 34 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Twenty-one percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 79 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

## ARSON

### Definition

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling, house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc..

- There were 397 arrests reported for arson offenses, a 17 percent decrease compared to 2006.
- Juveniles accounted for 56 percent and adults 44 percent of persons arrested for arson.
- Ninety percent of the total arson arrests were males while 10 percent were females.
- Seventy-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 26 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and non-Hispanics accounted for 85 percent.

# FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

## Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 2,140 arrests reported during the year for forgery or counterfeiting, a 1 percent increase compared to 2006.
- Adults accounted for 96 percent and juveniles accounted for 4 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 74 percent of the arrests and females 26 percent.
- Sixty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 36 percent were black, and the balance were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 27 percent of the arrests and 73 percent were non-Hispanic.

# FRAUD

## Definition

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 5,071 arrests reported during the year for fraud, which is a 6 percent decrease compared to 2006.
- Adult arrests represented 98 percent and juveniles 2 percent of the persons arrested.
- Males accounted for 69 percent and females 31 percent of the persons arrested for fraud.
- Sixty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 32 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- Nineteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 81 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# EMBEZZLEMENT

## Definition

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 136 persons arrested for embezzlement, a 12 percent increase compared to 2006.
- Ninety percent of those persons arrested were adults and 10 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 57 percent and females 43 percent of the persons arrested for embezzlement.
- Sixty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, and 36 percent were black and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and non-Hispanics accounted for 85 percent.

# STOLEN PROPERTY

## (Buying, Receiving, Possessing)

### Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- In 2007, there were 4,885 arrests reported for stolen property, a decrease of 12 percent compared to 2006.
- Of the total, 72 percent were adults and 28 percent were juveniles.
- Eighty-four percent were males and 16 percent were females.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were black, 46 percent were white, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-Hispanic.

## CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

### Definition

Criminal/Malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 7,870 arrests for criminal/malicious mischief, a decrease of 3 percent compared to 2006.
- Of the total, 54 percent were adults and 46 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 86 percent and females 14 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 24 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and non-Hispanics accounted for 84 percent.

## WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

### Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 5,794 arrests reported for weapon offenses, a decrease of 13 percent when compared to 2006.
- Of the total, 70 percent were adults and 30 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 91 percent and females 9 percent of those arrested.
- Fifty-one percent of the persons arrested were black, 48 percent were white, and the balance were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 21 percent of those arrested and 79 percent were non-Hispanic.

# PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

## Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc..

- There were 1,963 prostitution and commercialized vice arrests during 2007, representing a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 2006.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent, and juveniles 1 percent of the arrests.
- Thirty-four percent were males and 66 percent were females.
- Fifty-seven percent of the persons arrested were white, 37 percent were black, and 6 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 22 percent of those arrested and 78 percent were non-Hispanic.

# SEX OFFENSES

## Definition

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 1,748 sex offense arrests during 2007, representing a decrease of 7 percent when compared to 2006.
- Adults accounted for 82 percent, and juveniles 18 percent of the arrests.
- Ninety-six percent were males and 4 percent were females.
- Seventy-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 26 percent were black, and 3 percent were other races.
- Twenty-seven percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 73 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

## Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing/possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

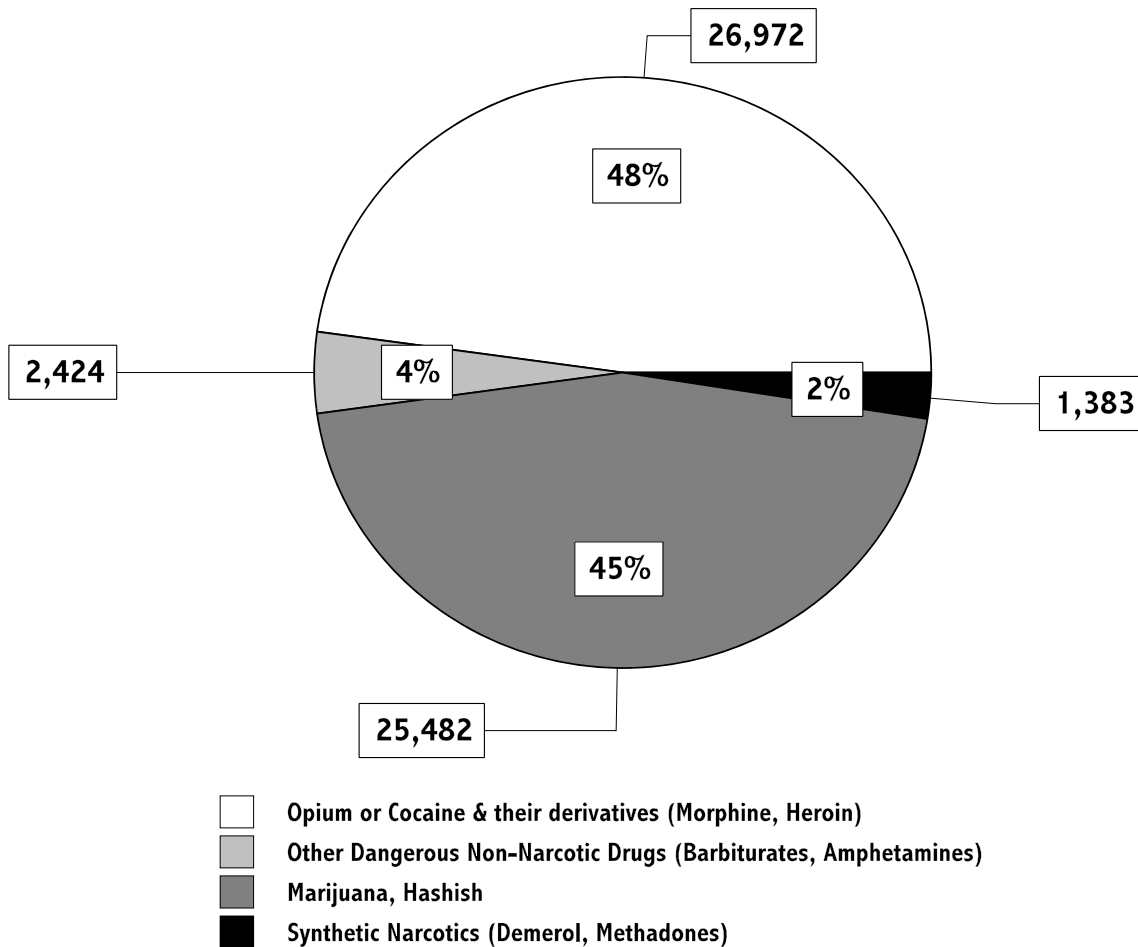
- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics—manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction—(Demerol, methadone).
- d. Other—dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens).

- There were 56,261 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for drug abuse violations, a decrease of 1 percent when compared to 2006.
- Adults accounted for 88 percent and juveniles 12 percent of the arrests.

- Thirty-three percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 84 percent of all the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 16 percent.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 45 percent were black, and the remaining 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 14 percent of those arrested and 86 percent were non-Hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 76 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 24 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 41 percent of the possession/use category and 69 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 48 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

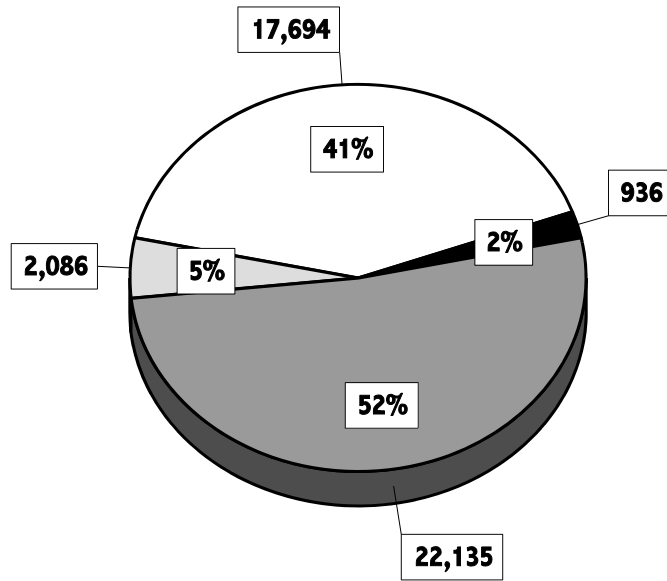

## POSSESSION/USE ARRESTS

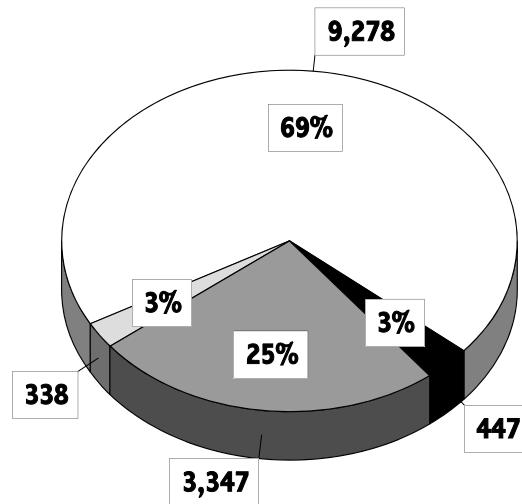

# GAMBLING

## Definition

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 693 gambling arrests reported during 2007, resulting in an increase of 38 percent compared to 2006.
- Eighty-one percent of the arrests were adults and 19 percent were juveniles.
- Males represented 73 percent and females 27 percent of the gambling arrests.
- Sixty-nine percent of the persons arrested were white, 22 percent were black, and 9 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 24 percent of the arrests and 76 percent were non-Hispanic.

# OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

## Definition

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 14,979 arrests for offenses against family and children during 2007, representing a decrease of 2 percent from 2006.
- Less than one-half of one percent of the arrests were juveniles, and 99.7 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 44 percent were black, while other races accounted for the remaining 1 percent.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of the arrests and 88 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

## Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 30,448 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 2007, an increase of 4 percent compared to 2006.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults and only 1 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Eighty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 12 percent were black, and the remaining 2 percent were other races.
- Twenty percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 80 percent were non-Hispanic.

# LIQUOR LAWS

## Definition

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of “driving under the influence.”

- There were 9,143 arrests reported for liquor law violations, a decrease of 2 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 68 percent of the arrests while the remaining 32 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 73 percent of the liquor law arrests while females accounted for the remaining 27 percent.
- Ninety-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 7 percent were black, and the remaining 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 11 percent of those arrested and 89 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# DISORDERLY CONDUCT

## Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 23,372 arrests reported for disorderly conduct, which was an increase of 5 percent when compared to 2006.
- Adults were responsible for 79 percent of the arrests while the remaining 21 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 79 percent of the disorderly conduct arrests while females accounted for the remaining 21 percent.
- Sixty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 36 percent were black, and the remaining 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 17 percent of those arrested and 83 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# VAGRANCY

## Definition

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc..

- There were 1,368 arrests in this category, a decrease of 14 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 98 percent of the arrests while the remaining 2 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent and females accounted for the remaining 20 percent of arrests in this category.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 44 percent were black, while other races accounted for 2 percent.
- Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of those arrested and 87 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# ALL OTHER OFFENSES

## Definition

Included in this category are all violations of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 163,643 arrests reported for all other offenses, an increase of 3 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 94 percent of the arrests while the remaining 6 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 46 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 16 percent of those arrested and 84 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

## Definition

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 4,861 arrests reported for curfew and loitering law violations, a decrease of 23 percent from the previous year.
- Males accounted for 72 percent and females accounted for the remaining 28 percent.
- Fifty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 48 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 30 percent of those arrested and 70 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

# RUNAWAYS

## Definition

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 4,647 runaway arrests reported, a decrease of 8 percent from the previous year.
- Females accounted for 57 percent of the arrests while males accounted for the remaining 43 percent.
- Fifty-seven percent of the persons arrested were black, 42 percent were white, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 27 percent of those arrested and 73 percent were not of Hispanic origin.
