Jersey Guard Soldiers turn on the heat to move tank across town

What happens when you take an M-60 tank, pack the gears with ice and add 13 years of rust to the treads? You create a long, cold day for a half dozen New Jersey Army National Guard Soldiers who drew the assignment of moving the 50-ton relic across Brick Township on Tuesday.

The mission for the troops from the Bordentown field maintenance shop was simple enough: move the tank from the now shuttered Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 5698 in Brick to a new home across town at VFW Post 8867. It was the kind of task they perform at least a half dozen times a year with ease.

Nothing, however, came easy on Tuesday. When the Soldiers arrived just after 8 a.m., it was 22 degrees. They linked the tank to the powerful winch on their Heavy Expanded Mobility Tactical Truck (HMMTT) and began to try to coax the tank off the two rotting pieces of wood where it's sat since it was donated to the VFW in 1996.

When Staff Sgt. Dennis Arnhold flipped a switch to start the winch, the air was filled with the sound of groaning metal. But the tank didn't budge. Nor did it move when the troops changed tactics by having the HMMTT to pull the tank. Pulling from the other direction didn't help either.

"I've never seen one stuck like this," Sgt. 1st Class James Walk-

er said, shaking his head.

Finally, the answer came to Walker. "Ice," he said. "The axle is full of ice. We've got to melt it."

A few minutes of work with a blowtorch and water began pouring out of one of the wheel sprockets. By 12:30 p.m., the tank was ready to be pulled from its resting place and loaded onto a flatbed truck.

Chief Warrant Officer Thomas Russo, the officer in charge of the move, looked satisfied.

"This is the toughest (tank move) I've seen," he said. "We got it done."

Chris Ross, the senior vice commander of Post 8867, said he was grateful the Soldiers never gave up. A small welcoming party had been gathering at his post on the other side of town in anticipation of the tank's arrival.

Ross said his post was honored to receive the tank. His post grew to about 800 members when Post 5698 closed three years ago due to declining membership. Most of the remaining members moved to Post 8867. Now the tank was following. The move represented more than five months of coordination between the VFW and the National Guard.

"This tank will stand in front of our post in honor of every veteran and every sacrifice they've made," said Ross, a Marine Corps veteran of the first Persian Gulf War.

The scholarships program is administered by Fisher House Foundation, a nonprofit organization that provides assistance to service members and their families.

Scholarship Managers, a national, nonprofit, scholarship management services organization, manages and awards the scholarships. Commissary vendors, manufacturers, brokers, suppliers and the general public donate money to the program, and every dollar donated goes directly to funding the scholarships.

Dependent, unmarried children, younger than age 21 (age 23 if enrolled as a full-time student at a college or university) of active duty personnel, Reserve, Guard and retired military members, survivors of service members who died while on active duty, or survivors of individuals who died while receiving retired pay from the military may apply for a scholarship. The applicant must be planning to attend, or already be attending, an accredited college or university full time in the fall of 2010, or be enrolled in a program of studies designed to transfer directly into a four-year program.

TSP contributions limits for 2010

For 2010, employees may contribute up to \$16,500 in tax-deferred money to the TSP. If a member of the uniformed services, employees may contribute a total of \$49,000 in tax-deferred and tax-exempt money. If employee will be age 50 or older during 2010, they may also contribute up to \$5,500 in additional “catch-up” contributions if they expect to reach the \$16,500 limit in 2010. TRICARE Dental offers options to repair tooth loss

FALLS CHURCH, Va. – December 24, 2009 – Tooth loss can be a difficult and sometimes embarrassing condition. Quality of life, confidence or daily functioning can be affected by the loss of permanent teeth.

TRICARE wants beneficiaries to know that conventional crown and bridge treatment and dentures aren’t the only options to address tooth loss. Dental implants are an option for medically qualified candidates. A thorough dental evaluation is required to determine whether a patient is a good candidate for dental implants. Good candidates for a dental implant are non-smokers with healthy gums and adequate bone remaining in the area where the implant will be placed.

A dental implant is a replacement for the root portion of a natural tooth and is surgically placed in the upper or lower jaw, below the gum line. After a healing period, the implant supports a crown or bridge, or secures a denture firmly in place.

Beneficiaries considering dental implants should speak with their dentist about the total cost of the procedure to determine their out-of-pocket expenses. On average, dental implants cost approximately \$1,500 to \$3,500 per tooth replacement. Beneficiaries should plan ahead to properly budget their annual dental benefit.

PLEASE NOTE: On January 18, 2010, the Military OneSource site will provide a link to the customized H&R Block At Home® product. Please wait until this link is posted on Military OneSource and use that link to access the customized product and create your account.

Do not go to the public H&R Block Web site to create a user account. If you create your account on the H&R Block Web site instead of through the Military OneSource site, the H&R Block system will treat your account as a public account. This means that you will receive the public version of the product instead of the customized Military OneSource product. The public version of is not the same as the customized Military OneSource product and it is not free.
