### Civilian bosses watch their Guard employees train

Boy Scout Troop 50 in Toms River will be without one of its five scout leaders for the next year and Moranti Mechanical of Toms River will lose one of its four employees.

New Jersey Army National Guard Sgt Timothy Gallagher will be the one absent in both places. The 31-year-old Toms River native is deploying to Afghanistan with the 119th Combat Sustainment Support Battalion.

On Wednesday, Marc Moranti, the person who will most miss Gallagher on the job-- and at the scout troop meetings – was among 19 New Jersey employers who traveled to Fort Indiantown Gap, Pa. on New Jersey Army National Guard helicopters for a trip sponsored by the Employer Support of the Guard and Reserve.

The federally-funded organization works to strengthen the bonds between employ-

ers and military reservists and organizes trips known as "Boss Lifts" to get employers to training sites where National Guard and other reserve units are making final preparations for combat deployments.

Moranti had a chance to meet up with Gallagher as his unit does some final training before deploying in February. Not only is Gallagher his best employee, he's a fellow leader of Troop 50. "I'm going to miss him on a lot of levels. He's my best employee and a good friend," Moranti said. "I'm proud of him. I wish I could do what he's doing. He's going off to defend America."

Lt. Gov. Christine Guadagno and Maj. Gen. Glenn K. Rieth, the Adjutant General, were on the trip along with state Sens. Diane Allen and David Norcross and Assemblyman Gilbert Wilson.

Rieth, the commander of

the 8,300-member New Jersey National Guard, told the bosses and lawmakers that Boss Lifts are a critical part of the effort to raise awareness among community leaders about the sacrifices made by guard members.

"In order to be able to serve, our Soldiers and Airmen need the support of their employers. It's critical" Rieth said.

Gallagher, an 11-year-veteran of the Army National Guard, said he knows he has Moranti's support.

"He's been so understanding about everything I've had to do to get ready to deploy," Gallagher said.

Moranti and the other employers watched on Wednesday as their Soldiers sprinted into an urban warfare training structure to practice clearing suspected insurgents from a building. Later, the employers got a chance to test out a training device Soldiers use to escape from an overturned vehicle.

• All workshops are being held at the New Jersey Forensic Science Technology Center in Hamilton Township (Mercer County), New Jersey.

• PERS/TPAF workshop times are at either 9:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. and are currently scheduled for February 2, March 23, April 13, 20 or 26, and June 22.

• PFRS workshops are currently scheduled for March 2, and May 25.

During the workshops, our representatives will take a step-bystep approach to explain

topics that include retirement benefits, beneficiary options, group life insurance, the

taxability of your pension, and health benefits in retirement.

Due to the recent increase in retirement applications, members must use the online Retirement Application available in MBOS. Submitting the application through MBOS reduces the chance of any delays in receipt of your application and provides for the fastest processing. \*Please also note that paper retirement applications will not be available and will not be accepted at the workshops.

#### PREPARE IN ADVANCE USING MBOS

If attending, members must print an Estimate of Retirement Benefits using the Member Benefits Online System (MBOS) and bring it to the workshop (retirement estimates will not be provided at the workshop). To register for MBOS go to:

www.state.nj.us/treasury/pensions/mbosregister.shtml and follow the registration instructions. Estimates obtained from MBOS are the same estimates obtained when visiting the Division's offices and use identical salary and service information.
