A handful of the 10,000 Boy Scouts took time out of the annual Camporee held at the National Training Center at Sea Girt on May 21 to welcome members of Gold Star families to the New Jersey National Guard family.

Led by Life Scout Craig Rieth, son of Maj. Gen. Glenn K. Rieth, the Adjutant General, the Gold Star Mothers Dinner coincided with Armed Forces Day to become a "meaningful celebration – not a memorial service."

Families in attendance included many surviving relatives of Soldiers and Marines who served in Iraq and Afghanistan, and the sisters of men who did not return from Vietnam and the famed Battle of the Bulge.

For Amy Moore and her husband Patrick, the grief is still fresh.

"They called him the mayor of Bordentown," Amy said of their son Spc. Benjamin Moore, who died in Afghanistan earlier this year. "He was all about helping people."

"He galvanized the community," Amy's brother-in-law Kevin Moore added. "At least there's something good coming out of it."

A junior firefighter at 16 and an EMT after high school, the Moores credit their Soldier's civic activities – and death – with increased youth participation in their hometown.

The drive to serve also inspired two Zilinski sons to join the military. Capt. Matthew J. Zilinski is company commander of the 508th Military Police. His older brother, 1st Lt. Dennis Zilinski,

a graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point, died in Iraq in 2005. Capt. Zilinski attended the dinner with his parents, Marian and Dennis Sr.

"(Dennis) was like a people magnet, that's what I like to say about him," Marian said. She also recalled the life-changing night when her family learned of their son's death.

"They, the uniformed officers, invite you into your own home," she said. "They ask you to sit down. I thought if I didn't sit down, they wouldn't tell me. But they do. They give you the news."

Working to organize the Camporee and dinner was Craig Shelley, Scout Executive for the Jersey Shore Council. "We want to help our Scouts recognize and support these families and the sac-

rifices they've made," he said. "This is part of the coaching and teaching of citizenship."

Judi Tapper, a Gold Star mother and President of the Dept. of New Jersey, American Gold Star Mothers, encouraged those present to "find solace with other mothers who share the same grief."

Amy Moore noted that "a lot of these Soldiers' stories sound the same. You have good kids, go-getters. They have similar personality traits."

"With other Gold Star families you can be yourself," Marian Zilinski added. "They won't say, well it's been five years, you should be over this."

"You wake up with it," Dennis Zilinski Sr. said. "You go to bed with it."

However, as Saturday's dinner demonstrated, New Jersey's Gold Star families do not have to be alone.

National Guard Militia Museum announces expanded summer hours

SEA GIRT, N.J. – The National Guard Militia Museum of New Jersey is pleased to announce expanded summer hours for its main museum at the historic National Guard Training Center in Sea Girt.

Beginning Friday, May 27, and running through Labor Day, the museum will open seven days a week from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

"We are fortunate that our museum sits within walking distance of some of the Garden State's most beautiful beaches," said 1st Lt.

Vincent Solomeno, historian of the New Jersey National Guard and the museum's curator. "With the summer season upon us, our expanded hours help us reach more visitors and in turn educate the public about our rich military history."

A permanent exhibit – "A Splendid Little War: New Jersey and the Spanish-American War" – is set to open July 1. In addition, a special exhibit chronicling the state's role in the emergency response to the September 11, 2001 attacks is slated for August.

Established in 1980, the National Guard Militia Museum of New Jersey at Sea Girt presents the role of the New Jersey Militia and the National Guard within the context of the larger history of the state. Collections include original and reproduction uniforms, weapons, photographs, artifacts and art from the period of Dutch, Swedish and British colonization through the War for Independence, Civil War and World Wars I and II to the present day, with particular attention paid to the diversity of the New Jersey citizen soldier and his or her experience.
