# One last mission for an aircraft with rich history

A Vietnam Veteran that entered military service during the Eisenhower administration retires from the New Jersey Air National Guard's 108th Air Refueling Wing tomorrow.

This retiree won't be playing golf in its golden years. Instead, this retiree, a KC-135E "Stratotanker," is bound for a marquis role as a display at the Air Mobility Command Museum at Dover Air Force Base.

But first, the Airmen of the 108th will say farewell to the aircraft at a ceremony at the Wing on McGuire Air Force Base tomorrow (Friday, Aug. 7) at 10 a.m.

Then the plane, which came into service in 1959, will fly its last mission, gassing up a C-5 cargo plane en route to Dover. And then, at 2 p.m., the aircraft will be officially inducted into the AMC Museum, becoming the 28th aircraft in a collection devoted to the history of air mobility.

A look at this aircraft's past is a study of Air Force history over the past five decades.

Commissioned in 1959, this aircraft was first assigned Offutt Air Force Base in Nebraska, then transferred to Barksdale in Louisiana and then it moved on to Thailand and the Philippines in support of combat operations over Vietnam.

The KC-135 was credited with changing the face of aerial combat in Vietnam by lengthening the time combat aircraft could spend over the battlefield. Built and designed by Boeing, the KC-135 was a relative of the 707, one of the most successful early wide-bodied commercial airliners. More than 800 KC-135s were built.

The E Model heading for retirement transferred to the Air Guard in 1975 and made its way to the 108th in 1984. In recent years, the aircraft flew numerous missions in support of operations in Afghanistan and Iraq.

And now, it's time for this plane to rest.

Remember those old mercury thermometers that Mom had to take your temperature, using an efficient snap of the wrist to get the inner liquid down to below 98.6 degrees? The inner liquid was mercury and the amount of mercury in that old thermometer was about 500 milligrams.

Those new compact fluorescent light bulbs also contain mercury, but much less. The mercury is sealed within the glass tubing and averages about four milligrams according to an EnergyStar report from the Environmental Protection Agency. Some manufacturers have recently dropped the amount of mercury in their CFLs to 1.4-2.5 milligrams.

There is no problem with the mercury until the bulb burns out or breaks. Then there may be a problem.

If it is burned out, Home Depot offers a recycling program. Simply take your unbroken bulb to the returns desk at any Home Depot where it will be sent to a recycler who properly handles the CFL bulbs. Or your local recycler may have a day for hazardous waste. Never send a CFL or other mercury containing product to an incinerator.

If your blub breaks, the greatest risk you face is getting cut from the glass pieces; the small amount of mercury does not pose a large risk. Research indicates that there is no immediate health risk to you or your family should a bulb break and it's cleaned up properly. You can minimize any risks by following proper clean-up and disposal guidelines from the EPA. # Dorney Park offers discount to military

Dorney Park and Wildwater Kingdom in Allentown, Pa., is offering a discount to the military and their families. A discount for military personnel is available at the park entrance. At the ticket window, please present a valid military photo ID card to purchase a regular one-day admission ticket for only \$24.99 during the Early and Bonus Seasons and only \$32.99 each during the summer season (May 23 - Sept. 7). The military discount is available for all active or retired military personnel (including the National Guard, Reserves, and Coast Guard). Immediate family members include spouse, children, parents, grandparents and grandchildren. Military discount tickets must be purchased at the gate (a valid military ID must be presented to receive the discount). If the military person is currently deployed overseas, the family members are eligible for the military discount as long as they show a current military family ID when purchasing tickets.

#### Family Readiness Council offers grants

The New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council has increased the amounts of family and business grants up to \$5,000 and \$10,000, respectively. Both are known as TIER I grants. TIER II family grants are also available to New Jersey Army and Air National Guard non-deployed service members who were on State Active Duty or State Missions (e.g., hurricanes, floods, border missions) for more than 20 consecutive days. Service members meeting these criteria are eligible to apply for a financial hardship grant up to \$1,500. Applications are available at all New Jersey Army and Air National Guard Family Assistance Centers.



### Obama: Health care reform won't impact VA, Tricare

WASHINGTON, Aug. 4, 2009 - In ongoing discussions about health-care reform, President Barack Obama offered assurance today to those receiving medical care through Tricare or the Department of Veterans Affairs: Your benefits are safe.

Eligibility for health care under VA or Tricare "will not be affected by our efforts at broader health-care reform," Obama told military reporters at the White House today.

"I want to make sure that message gets out to our veterans," the president said. "I think it's very important to get the message out: If you are in the VA system and are happy with your care, great. We have no intention of changing your eligibility."

While a new, national program won't force anyone to change health-care systems, Obama said it could offer benefits or geographic convenience that might make some veterans elect to join it. A national program "will actually give them more choices, more flexibility," he said.

The VA "has probably made more progress than most systems out there in increasing quality" during the past 25 years, and could help shed light on better ways of delivering health care, he said.

But the cost of delivering that care is high even at VA, and Tricare consumes a big piece of the Defense Department's budget, he said.

With the fiscal 2010 budget reflecting the largest VA funding increase in 30 years, Obama told American Legion leaders he is committed to ensuring that VA provides America's veterans the highest-quality health care possible.

Meanwhile, he told reporters VA will increase its outreach to more veterans to make sure they're aware of their medical benefits and other entitlements.

"Although there are hundreds of thousands of veterans who are using our services, we know there are hundreds of thousands more who may not know that benefits are available," he said.

"And we are working really hard to make sure that every single veteran – not just our active force, but also National Guard and reservists, are aware of the benefits that are available to them.


