# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE NEW JERSEY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY HELD AT 103 COLLEGE ROAD EAST, PRINCETON, NEW JERSEY ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 27, 2015

### **ITEMS OF DISCUSSION**

### 1. Approval of the Minutes of the Executive Session of May 19, 2015

The minutes of the meeting of May 19, 2015 were hand delivered to Governor Chris Christie under the date of May 21, 2015. Mr. Petrecca moved that the minutes of the meeting be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Mr. Rodriguez and passed. Mr. Edwards abstained from the vote.

### 2. Approval of the Minutes of the Executive Session of June 22, 2015

The minutes of the meeting of June 22, 2015 were delivered via United Parcel Service to Governor Chris Christie under the date of June 23, 2015. Mr. Rodriguez moved that the minutes of the meeting be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Mr. Petrecca and passed. Mr. Edwards abstained from the vote.

### 3. Approval of the Minutes of the Executive Session of July 20, 2015

The minutes of the meeting of July 20, 2015 were hand delivered to Governor Chris Christie under the date of July 20, 2015. Mr. Hutchinson moved that the minutes of the meeting be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Mr. Petrecca and passed. Mr. Edwards abstained from the vote.

### 4. Approval of the Minutes of the Meeting of July 20, 2015

The minutes of the meeting of July 20, 2015 were hand delivered to Governor Chris Christie under the date of July 20, 2015. Mr. Hutchinson moved that the minutes of the meeting be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Mr. Rodriguez and passed unanimously. Mr. Edwards abstained from the vote.

### 5. Approval of the Minutes of the Meeting of September 22, 2015

The minutes of the meeting of September 22, 2015 were hand delivered to Governor Chris Christie under the date of September 23, 2015. Mr. Petrecca moved that the minutes of the meeting be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Mr. Hutchinson and passed unanimously.

### 6. Market Update - Lamont Financial Services Corporation

Robert A. Lamb, President of Lamont Financial Services Corporation provided the Members with a market update report that included commentary on current market conditions.

### 7. Executive Director's Report

Ms. Stitt expressed her thanks to the Members and to Governor Christie for the opportunity to serve as Acting Executive Director during the current transition. Ms. Stitt stated that she especially appreciated the support she received from Mr. Jacobs, Ms. Hendricks, Mr. Edwards and Mr. Petrecca who had been a tremendous resource as the Authority worked through various transactions over the past 11 months. Ms. Stitt also thanked Ms. Herbold and Mr. Rones for their invaluable assistance. Ms. Stitt particularly thanked the EFA staff and highlighted their tremendous work over the past year. Ms. Stitt stated that every accomplishment in the past months is attributed to staff's hard work and a credit to their commitment to the Authority and to the colleges and universities.

Ms. Stitt updated the Members on upcoming projects in the Accounting and Project Management departments.

### 8. Report on Pending Projects

Mr. Nelson reported that there are several projects for which various colleges and universities have requested Authority financing. Mr. Nelson briefly described the projects and reported that the projects are under review and at various stages of development.

A summary of the projects to be financed, together with estimated financing amounts and proposed sale dates, is appended as Exhibit I.

Mr. Nelson also reported on financings that have closed so far this year since January 1, 2015.

# 9. Report on the Sale of NJEFA Revenue Bonds, The William Paterson University of New Jersey Issue, Series 2015 C, In the Amount of \$45,695,000

Mr. Nelson reported that on August 6, 2015, the Authority priced \$45,695,000 in revenue and revenue refunding bonds for The William Paterson University of New Jersey. He reported that the transaction financed capital projects on the University's campus and refunded the Authority's Series 2005 E bonds for debt service savings, which on a present value savings basis totaled \$2,100,000. Mr. Nelson reported that the transaction had a true interest cost of 3.54% and successfully closed on August 18, 2015.

A copy of the Bond Sale Summary for the issue is appended as Exhibit II.

### 10. Report on the Sale of NJEFA Revenue Refunding Bonds, Kean University Issue, Series 2015 H, In the Amount of \$117,175,000

Mr. Nelson reported that on August 11, 2015, the Authority priced \$117,175,000 in revenue refunding bonds for Kean University. He reported that the transaction refunded the Authority's Series 1998 B, 2005 B and 2007 D bonds and generated present value savings of \$5,800,000. Mr. Nelson reported that the transaction had a true interest cost of 3.76% and closed on August 27, 2015.

A copy of the Bond Sale Summary for the issue is appended as Exhibit III.

### 11. Report on the Sale of NJEFA Revenue Refunding Bonds, The College of New Jersey Issue, Series 2015 G, In the Amount of \$114,525,000

Mr. Nelson reported that on August 19, 2015, the Authority priced \$114,525,000 in revenue refunding bonds for The College of New Jersey. He reported that the transaction partially refunded the Authority's 2008 D bonds and generated present value savings of \$3,800,000. Mr. Nelson reported that the transaction had a true interest cost of 3.30% and closed on September 17, 2015.

Mr. Nelson reported that in total, the Authority priced nearly \$280,000,000 in par in a 13 day period in early to mid-August, with present value savings totaling nearly \$12,000,000, all benefiting public institutions.

### 12. Report on Operating and Construction Fund Statements and Disbursements

Ms. Mueller reviewed the Results of Operations and Budget Variance Analysis and reported on the status of construction funds and related investments for September 30, 2015.

## 13. Resolution Appointing an Executive Director and Secretary of the Authority

Mr. Jacobs presented a resolution appointing Jeremy A. Spector as Executive Director and Secretary of the Authority and requested a motion to adopt the resolution. Mr. Jacobs stated that he looked forward to working with Mr. Spector.

Mr. Petrecca moved the adoption of the following entitled resolution:

### NEW JERSEY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY 2015 BUDGET VARIANCE ANALYSIS FOR NINE MONTHS ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 2015

### Executive Summary

The NJEFA concluded September with year-to-date net operating income in the amount of \$1,174,967, based on revenues of \$2,831,436 and expenses of \$1,656,469. As a result, net operating income is higher than budgeted by \$760,211. This difference is a result of greater than budgeted revenues in the amount of \$254,830 and less than budgeted expenses in the amount of \$505,381.

#### Revenues

Revenues were \$254,830 above the budgeted amount through September primarily due to an increase in bond issuance activity.

#### Expenses

Operating expenditures for nine months of the year were favorable as compared to budget by \$505,381. Most of the line items display positive deviations and are primarily the result of staff vacancies and timing.
