ITEMS OF DISCUSSION

1. Approval of the Minutes of the Meeting of May 25, 2010

The minutes of the meeting of May 25, 2010 were hand delivered to Governor Chris Christie under the date of May 26, 2010. Mr. Hutchinson moved that the minutes of the meeting be approved as presented, the motion was seconded by Mr. Landgraf and passed unanimously.

2. Report on Pending Projects

Ms. Darby, Director of Project Management, reported that there are several projects for which various colleges and universities have requested Authority financing. Ms. Darby briefly described the projects and reported that the projects are under review and at various stages of development.

A summary of the projects to be financed, together with estimated financing amounts and proposed sale dates, is appended as Exhibit I.

Mr. Hodes joined the meeting during the report on pending projects.

3. Market Update - Phoenix Advisors, LLC

Mr. Inverso provided the Members with a market update report that included commentary on current market conditions.

4. Report on Tax-Exempt Lease Financing on Behalf of Kean University in the Amount of \$10,000,000

Ms. Darby reported that on June 10, 2010, the Authority completed a tax-exempt equipment lease transaction on behalf of Kean University. She reported that the lease was competitively bid to the Authority's prequalified pool of lease providers and was awarded to TD Equipment Finance, Inc. at an interest rate of 3.14%. The proceeds will be used for the acquisition and installation of various equipment for the University's science building.

A copy of the Transaction Summary for the issue is appended as Exhibit II.

5. Resolution Approving Procurement of Insurance Coverage

Ms. Mueller reported that the Authority's insurance is up for renewal on July 1, 2010. She reported that on April 9, 2010 the Authority distributed an RFQ to seven firms for insurance broker, advertised the RFQ in The Times and The Star Ledger and posted it on the Authority's and the State's websites. She reported that two brokerage firms submitted qualifications and, after evaluation by staff, including Chuck O'Loughlin, Risk Manager for the State Colleges, based on price, coverage and other factors, staff recommended accepting both the proposal of Willis of New Jersey, Inc. for insurance broker for three years and the firm's recommendation for insurance coverage for the upcoming year.

Mr. English described the insurance term sheets.

Mr. Hodes moved the adoption of the following entitled resolution:

RESOLUTION OF THE NEW JERSEY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN INSURANCE BROKER AND AUTHORIZING PROCUREMENT OF INSURANCE COVERAGE

The motion was seconded by Mr. Landgraf and passed unanimously.

The renewal term sheets and exhibits are appended as Exhibit III.

6. Report on Operating and Construction Fund Statements

Ms. Mueller, Controller, reviewed the Results of Operations and Budget Variance Analysis and reported on the status of construction funds and related investments.

Mr. Hutchinson moved that the reports be accepted as presented; the motion was seconded by Mr. Landgraf and passed unanimously.

The reports are appended as Exhibit IV.

7. Directors' Update

Ms. Darby reported that the Authority had received proposals to its RFP for Financial Advisor services and that staff was in the process of evaluating the proposals and expects to have a recommendation at the July meeting.

Ms. Newell reported that the Authority had distributed an RFQ for Post Issuance Compliance services. It has been posted on the Authority's and the State's websites and advertised in *The Bond Buyer.* The Authority is currently waiting for responses.

Ms. Stitt reported that plans for the National Association of Health and Educational Facilities Finance Authorities conference are progressing well. The conference is scheduled for September 22-24, 2010 in Jersey City. Ms. Stitt provided the Members a draft of the agenda and advised that staff would be meeting with the Authority's Treasurer Josh Hodes in a few weeks to discuss the conference's further progress.

8. Executive Session

Mr. Landgraf moved the adoption of a resolution of the Authority permitting an Executive Session for discussion of a legal matter; the motion was seconded by Mr. Hutchinson and passed unanimously.

Mr. Landgraf moved that the public session be reconvened; the motion was seconded by Mr. Hutchinson and passed unanimously.

9. Next Meeting Date

Chair Jacobs announced that the next meeting will be on Tuesday, July 27, 2010 at the Authority's office.

Chair Jacobs stated that Ms. Cannon had arranged for Richard Levao, President of Bloomfield College and newly elected Treasurer of the New Jersey Presidents' Council, to discuss a recent Presidents' Council report on the economic impact of higher education in New Jersey at the July meeting. The time of the next meeting will be announced shortly.

Mr. Jacobs requested a motion to adjourn and Mr. Landgraf moved that the meeting be adjourned at 9:57 a.m.; the motion was seconded by Mr. Hutchinson and passed unanimously.

RESOLUTION OF THE NEW JERSEY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY APPROVING THE APPOINTMENT OF AN INSURANCE BROKER AND AUTHORIZING PROCUREMENT OF INSURANCE COVERAGE

WHEREAS:

The New Jersey Educational Facilities Authority (the "Authority") was created pursuant to the New Jersey Educational Facilities Authority Law (being Chapter 72A of Title 18A of the New Jersey Statutes, as amended and supplemented), N.J.S.A. 18A:72A-1 et seq. (the "Act") and authorized to issue its obligations to provide a means for New Jersey public and private colleges and universities to obtain financing to construct educational facilities as defined in the Act; and

WHEREAS:

The Authority is required in order to fulfill contractual obligations and in order to operate in a prudent business manner to carry property insurance, liability insurance, automobile insurance, workers compensation and directors and officers liability insurance; and

WHEREAS:

The term of appointment for the Authority's Insurance Broker and the current insurance policies expire on June 30, 2010; and

WHEREAS:

The Authority has determined it is advisable to appoint a successor Insurance Broker for a period of three years from July 1, 2010 to June 30, 2013 with an optional one-year renewal; and

WHEREAS:

In order to select a firm to serve as Insurance Broker for such period, the staff of the Authority distributed the Request for Qualifications/Request for Proposals dated April 9, 2010 ("RFQ/RFP") which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference to a list of seven firms, and posted the RFQ/RFP on its website and advertised in the <u>Trenton Times</u> and the Star Ledger; and

WHEREAS:

The Authority received two responses from firms to the RFQ/RFP submitting their qualifications (the "Qualification Responses"); and

WHEREAS:

The Authority staff reviewed the Qualification Responses and, based on satisfaction of legal conditions to qualification, experience and other factors, assigned "markets" to each of the respective firms;

WHEREAS:

For this purpose, the term "markets" means the type of insurance the Authority requires and the insurance companies from which to seek quotes for that type of insurance; and

WHEREAS:

One of the responding firms submitted a proposal to serve as the Authority's Insurance Broker along with recommendations for insurance carriers in its respective assigned markets (the "Proposal"); and

WHEREAS: The Authority staff has reviewed the Proposal and has determined, based on price and other factors, that it would be in the best interest of the Authority to accept the Proposal of Willis of New Jersey, Inc. (the "Firm"), appoint such Firm as the Authority's Insurance Broker and accept the Firm's recommendations for insurance coverage for the current yearly renewal under the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution, the RFQ/RFP, and the Firm's Proposal which is appended hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference (the "Response"); and

WHEREAS: The Firm will be appointed for three (3) years from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013, with the Authority having the option to renew the appointment for an additional one-year period; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE NEW JERSEY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY THAT:

- SECTION 1. The Authority hereby appoints the Firm to serve as the Authority's Insurance Broker for the three (3) year period from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013, with the Authority having the option to renew the appointment for an additional one (1) year period, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution, the RFQ/RFP and the Response.
- SECTION 2. The Authority hereby authorizes procurement of insurance coverage for the period July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011 with the insurance carriers, for the respective types of insurance coverage and on the terms and conditions summarized in Exhibit "C" attached hereto.
- SECTION 3. The Authority hereby authorizes the Executive Director, the Deputy Executive Director or the Controller to take and do any and all acts and things as may be necessary or desirable in connection with implementation of this Resolution.
- **SECTION 4.** This Resolution shall take effect in accordance with the Act.

NEW JERSEY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY 2010 BUDGET VARIANCE ANALYSIS FOR FIVE MONTHS ENDED MAY 31, 2010

Executive Summary

The NJEFA concluded the first five months of 2010 with net operating income in the amount of \$307,143, based on revenues of \$1,564,336 and expenses of \$1,257,193. As a result, net operating income is higher than budgeted by \$85,323. This difference is a result of less than budgeted expenses in the amount of \$128,972 partially offset by less than expected revenues in the amount of \$43,649.

Revenues

Revenues were \$43,649 less than projected due to less than expected bond issuance activity and lower than anticipated investment income.

Expenses

Operating expenditures for the first five months of the year were favorable as compared to budget by \$128,972. Attorney General Fees were \$32,085 less than budgeted. The remaining line items display positive deviations and are primarily the result of timing.
