The Grand Jurors of and for the State of New Jersey, upon
their oaths, present that:

COUNT ONE

(Conspiracy - Second Degree)

STEVEN PEREZ

ANDRES FIGUEIRAS

JOSHUA MARTINEZ

EDWIN BAEZ

and

PAUL GALDAMES

on or about October 15, 2000, at the City of Hoboken, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, with the purpose of promoting or facilitating the commission of the crimes of aggravated assault, possession of a weapon with intent to use it unlawfully and hindering apprehension or prosecution, did agree that:

A. One or more of them would engage in conduct which would constitute the aforesaid crime, or

B. One or more of them would aid in the planning, solicitation or commission of the said crimes, that is:

1. Knowingly or purposely to cause or attempt to cause serious bodily injury to another, that is, William Olavarria, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(1) and (2);

2. Knowingly to possess a deadly weapon, that is, a knife, with purpose to use it unlawfully against the person of another, that is, William Olavarria, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-4; and

3. Purposely hinder the apprehension of themselves or another or to suppress as evidence a knife used in the assault of another, that is, William Olavarria, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:29-3a(3) and b(1).

All in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:5-2, and against the peace

of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT TWO

(Aggravated Assault - Second Degree)

and

PAUL GALDAMES

on or about October 15, 2000, at the City of Hoboken, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely or knowingly did attempt to cause serious bodily injury to William Olavarria, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(1) and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT THREE

(Aggravated Assault - Third Degree)

EDWIN BAEZ

and

PAUL GALDAMES

on or about October 15, 2000, at the City of Hoboken, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did attempt to cause or purposely or knowingly caused bodily injury to William Olavarria, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(2) and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT FOUR

(Possession of a Weapon for an Unlawful
Purpose - Third Degree)

JOSHUA MARTINEZ

EDWIN BAEZ

and

PAUL GALDAMES

on or about October 15, 2000, at the City of Hoboken, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did knowingly possess a deadly weapon, that is a knife, with purpose to use same unlawfully against the person or property of another by committing the crime of aggravated assault against William Olavarria, in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-4d and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT FIVE

(Unlawful Possession of a Weapon - Fourth Degree)

STEVEN PEREZ

ANDRES FIGUEIRAS

JOSHUA MARTINEZ

EDWIN BAEZ

and

PAUL GALDAMES

on or about October 15, 2000, at the City of Hoboken, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly or purposely did possess a certain weapon, that is, a knife, under circumstances not manifestly appropriate for such lawful uses as it may have, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-5(d) and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

(Hindering Apprehension or Prosecution -
Third Degree)





on or about October 15, 2000, at the City of Hoboken, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere and within the jurisdiction of this Court, with purpose to hinder their own apprehension, prosecution, conviction or punishment, did suppress by way of concealment or destruction, evidence of the crime of the aggravated assault of William Olavarria, that is a knife, which might aid in their discovery or apprehension or in the lodging of a charge against them, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:29-3b(1) and N.J.S.A. 2C:2-6, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.
