

AN ACT concerning pronouncement of death and amending 1 2 P.L.1983, c.308. 3 4 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 5 of New Jersey: 6 7 1. Section 4 of P.L.1983, c.308 (C.26:6-8.1) is amended to read 8 as follows: 9 4. a. Where there has been an apparent death <sup>1</sup>that is not governed by the provisions of section 4 of P.L.1991, c.90 (C.26:6A-10 11  $(4)^{1}$ , a registered professional nurse licensed by the New Jersey Board of Nursing under P.L.1947, c.262 (C.45:11-23 et seq.) may 12 13 make the actual determination and pronouncement of death and 14 shall attest to this pronouncement by: signing in the space 15 designated for this signature on the certificate of death under 16 R.S.26:6-7; or, for the purposes of the NJ-EDRS, transmitting orally or in writing a report of the pronouncement to the attending, 17 covering or resident physician, or the county medical examiner. 18 19 b. [The provisions of subsection a. of this section shall only 20 apply in the case of a death which occurs in the home or place of 21 residence of the deceased, in a hospice, or in a long-term care <sup>1</sup>(<sup>1</sup><u>Deleted by amendment</u>, 22 facility nursing home. or P.L., c. (pending before the Legislature as this bill) [1, ]23 (cf: P.L.2003, c.221, s.6) 24 25 26 2. This act shall take effect on the 60th day after enactment.
