



2. N.J.A.C. 13:69G-1.3(a)4 authorizes the exclusion of

any person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or licensed gaming therein, including

iii Persons who pose a threat to the safety of the patrons or employee sof a casino licensee

iv. Persons with a documented history of conduct involving the undue disruption of the gaming operations of casino licensees

3. On February 4, 2011, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Borgata Hotel Casino and Spa after having been previously evicted. On February 17, 2011, Gomez was convicted of this offense in Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to other penalties, Gomez was barred from Borgata Hotel Casino and Spa for a period of two years.

4. On February 20, 2011, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Caesar's Atlantic City after having been previously evicted. On May 2, 2011, Gomez was convicted of this offense in Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to other penalties, Gomez was barred from Caesar's Atlantic City for a period of two years.

5. On April 16, 2011, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal

Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Caesar's Atlantic City after having been previously evicted. On May 2, 2011, Gomez was convicted of this offense in Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to other penalties, Gomez was barred from Caesar's Atlantic City for a period of two years.

6. On November 5, 2011, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Borgata Hotel Casino and Spa after having been previously evicted. On November 14, 2011, Gomez was convicted of this offense in Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to other penalties, Gomez was barred from Borgata Hotel Casino and Spa for a period of two years. This offense violated a previous barment order.

7. On December 21, 2011, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Caesar's Atlantic City after having been previously evicted. On February 28, 2012, Gomez was convicted of this offense in Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to other penalties, Gomez was barred from Caesar's Atlantic City for a period of two years. This offense violated previous barment orders.

8. On May 14, 2012, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Bally's Atlantic City after having been previously evicted. On May 23, 2012, Gomez was convicted of this offense in Atlantic City Municipal Court. In addition to other penalties, Gomez was barred from Bally's

Atlantic City for a period of two years.

9. On April 17, 2013, Gomez was arrested and charged with Criminal Trespass, contrary to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-3. Gomez reentered Golden Nugget Hotel and Casino after having been previously evicted. On May 21, 2013, Gomez failed to appear in Atlantic City Municipal Court, and a bench warrant was issued for her arrest.

10. Based on information contained in Paragraphs 1 through 9 of this petition, Gomez is a person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interests of the State of New Jersey or licensed gaming therein and should be excluded from casino premises pursuant to N.J.A.C.13:69G-1.3(a)4.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner demands the following relief against Respondent, Laure A. Gomez a.k.a. Laurie A. Ralston:

A. Judgment that the Respondent, Laure A. Gomez a.k.a. Laurie A. Ralston, is a person whose presence in a licensed casino establishment would be inimical to the interest of the State of New Jersey or of licensed gaming therein, within the meaning of N.J.A.C.13:69G-1.3(a)4;

B. Judgment entering a Final Order placing Respondent, Laure A. Gomez a.k.a. Laurie A. Ralston, on the exclusion list pursuant to N.J.S.A. 5:12-71(l) and 13:69G-1.3(a)4; and,

C. Judgment for such other and further relief as the Director may deem just and appropriate under the circumstances.
