INDICTMENT

The Grand Jurors of and for the State of New Jersey, upon their oaths, present that:

COUNT ONE

(Attempted Murder - First Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did attempt to cause the death of another person, by his own conduct, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:11-3 and N.J.S.A. 2C:5-1, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT TWO

(Aggravated Assault - Second Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did attempt to cause serious bodily injury to another person, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(1), and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT THREE

(Aggravated Assault - Third Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did attempt to cause bodily injury to another person with a deadly weapon, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(2), and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT FOUR

(Aggravated Assault - Third Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly did under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, point a firearm at or in the direction of Detective Gregory Austin or Detective Sergeant Christian Eskridge, both law enforcement officers of the New Jersey State Police, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(9), and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT FIVE

(Aggravated Assault - Fourth Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly did under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the value of human life, point a firearm at or in the direction of another person, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:12-1b(4), and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT SIX

(Unlawful Possession of a Weapon - Second Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly did possess a certain weapon, that is, a Hi-Point .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun, S/N P888755, without having a first obtained a permit to carry same as provided in N.J.S.A. 2C:58-4, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-5b, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT SEVEN

(Unlawful Possession of a Weapon - First Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, having been convicted of Robbery under Atlantic County Indictment No. 07-01-00007-I, knowingly did possess a certain weapon, that is, a Hi-Point .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun, S/N P888755, without having a first obtained a permit to carry same as provided in N.J.S.A. 2C:58-4, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-5b and N.J.S.A. 2C:39-5j, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT EIGHT

(Possession of a Weapon by a
Convicted Person - Second Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, having been convicted of Robbery under Atlantic County Indictment No. 07-01-00007-I, knowingly did purchase, own, possess or control a certain weapon, that is, a Hi-Point .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun, S/N P888755, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-7b, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT NINE

(Possession of a Weapon for
an Unlawful Purpose- Second Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did possess a certain weapon, that is, a Hi-Point .380 caliber semi-automatic handgun, S/N P888755, with purpose to use it unlawfully against the person or property of another, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:39-4a, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT TEN

(Resisting Arrest By Flight - Fourth Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did attempt to prevent Detective Gregory Austin or Detective Sergeant Christian Eskridge, law enforcement officers of the New Jersey State Police, from effecting a lawful arrest by taking flight, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:29-2a(2), and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT ELEVEN


(Obstructing Administration of Law or
Other Governmental Function- Fourth Degree)

JOSE A. LOPEZ

On or about November 16, 2014, in the Borough of Woodbine, in the County of Cape May, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did attempt to prevent Detective Gregory Austin or Detective Sergeant Christian Eskridge, public servants, from lawfully performing an official function by means of intimidation, force, violence or physical interference or obstacle, or by means of an independently unlawful act, that is, by fleeing from the when they attempted to place him under arrest and discarding evidence while in flight, thereby obstructing the detection or investigation of a crime or the prosecution of a person for a crime, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:29-1, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.
