## PVSC Wins ACEC Distinguished Award For Its Old Sludge Storage Tanks Rehabilitation Project

Newark, NJ – The American Council of Engineering Companies ("ACEC") announced the 2022 recipients of its annual Engineering Excellence Awards at a recent awards banquet at Forsgate Country Club in Monroe, NJ. The Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission ("PVSC") was honored with the ACEC's *Distinguished Award* for


its Old Sludge Storage ("OSS") Tanks Rehabilitation Project.

PVSC's 1.6 million-gallon OSS tanks were constructed in the 1960's. They receive barged sludge from the New York City Department of Environmental Protection, Bergen County Utilities Authority, among other customers. Factors such as weather, constant usage

and the passage of time have contributed to their corrosion.

The rehabilitation project restored the tanks with a unique corrosionresistant liner, repaired the stair tower and pumping station, and designed a new force main to allow for the transmission of contents from the Old Sludge Storage Tanks to PVSC's Primary Clarifier influent channel. The project also included rehabilitating concrete floors and metal walls, removing hazardous coatings, and demolishing catwalks, a water cannon system and old sample ports.

Lino DeAlmeida, a PVSC Senior Engineer, attended the banquet and accepted the award on behalf of the agency. Also honored with a *Distinguished Award* was HDR, Inc., the engineering, architecture,
