PUBLIC QUESTION NO. 1

NEW JERSEY TRANSPORTATION
 REHABILITATION AND IMPROVEMENT
 BOND ISSUE

Shall the following act be approved: "An Act authorizing the creation of a debt of the State of New Jersey by issuance of bonds of the State in the sum of \$475,000,000.00 for the purpose of improving the transportation system of the State, including the improvement of State highways, county and municipal roads and public transportation facilities; providing the ways and means to pay and discharge the principal thereof and interest thereon; providing for the submission of this act to the people at a general election; and making an appropriation?"

Interpretive Statement

Approval of this act would provide \$150 million for public transportation improvements, \$80 million for State aid to county and municipal roads and \$245 million for improvements to State highways for a total of \$475 million in State Bonds. These funds are essential to make necessary repairs and improvements which cannot be financed by State and local budgets. These moneys used in combination with Federal and other funds will generate approximately \$2 billion towards financing a rehabilitation and improvement program for New Jersey's deteriorating transportation system.

(2) the construction of needed academic and support space throughout the State system of Higher Education.
