Drug tests are ordered for a variety of reasons, making future metrics difficult to predict. Examples range from random testing, routine testing (Therapeutic Community Program, Pre-Release testing) to circumstances involving Reasonable Suspicion including orders by Disciplinary Program Hearing Officers.

Population counts are calculated by averaging all Friday census counts within each calendar month. Population targets are for Average Weekly Forecasted Population for Fiscal Year 2017.

#### NOTES:

The Percentage of State Facility Education Act (SFEA) Inmates who were Awarded a High School Diploma metric describes the percentage of SFEA inmates who received a HS diploma within the entire FY. It is calculated by dividing the average number of SFEA inmates who received a HS diploma within that fiscal year to the average number of SFEA inmates enrolled within that fiscal year.

The Percentage of High School Equivalency Test Takers that had Passing Scores is calculated as the number of persons who passed the HSE exam divided by the total number of persons who were administered the exam.

The Mandatory Education Enrollment Rate is a reflection of the service target and the number of inmates enrolled in mandatory education.

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
