Treasurer Announces New Director for Division of Revenue

TRENTON – Treasurer Bradley Abelow today announced that Acting Division of Revenue Director James Fruscione has been named Director of the division.

“Jim has overseen numerous modernizations to our collections processes and been integral in our efforts to make it easier for businesses to register and file required reports,” Treasurer Abelow said. “He has a proven commitment to excellence.”

Fruscione has spent more than two decades in State government and currently serves as the acting Director of the Division of Revenue. He formerly was the deputy director of the division.

As Acting Director, Fruscione oversees the Division of Revenue's three branches, which collectively comprise New Jersey's centralized tax/report filing and payment processing operations, business registry service, and non-tax debt collection program. He manages a staff of more than 600 full-time and seasonal employees.

Prior to its consolidation with the Department of Treasury, Fruscione was the Director of the Division of Commercial Recording in the Department of State, where he was responsible for managing New Jersey's commercial recording program, including corporate filings, Uniform Commercial Code transactions, notary public commissions, trademark and trade name registrations and associated reporting and information retrieval services.

Fruscione began his career in government at the Department of State as an analyst and later a supervisor in the Division of Archive and Records Management where he conducted and coordinated record inventories throughout State government and at county

and municipal offices. At the Division he also developed staff time management and performance evaluation for the professional staff.

After the Division of Commercial Recording was consolidated with the Division of Revenue in Treasury he served as the Assistant Director for Business Services before becoming Deputy Director of the division.

Fruscione earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Rider University, where he graduated magna cum laude. He holds a Master of Arts in European History from Seton Hall University and a Master of Arts in Public Administration from Rider University, where he graduated with distinction.

He resides in Lawrence Township (Mercer County).
