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Superior Chapter Award Application



The Superior Chapter Award is designed to recognize FFA chapters that actively implement the mission and strategies of the organization and provide educational experiences for the entire membership.



Eligibility

- The chapter must be in good standing with the New Jersey State FFA Association at the time of application.
- · Applications can only include activities that have occurred between April 1 of the previous school year and March 31 of the current school year.
- The chapter must meet the minimum criteria outlined in the National Quality Chapter Standards
- The chapter must conduct at least one activity related to each of the fifteen quality standards.

Overview

- Only applications generated in AET will be accepted.
- The application must be submitted through AET (Submission List) by April 1st or date listed in the current Calendar of Events. Late applications will NOT be accepted.
- The Superior Chapter Award application is designed to collect information about one activity, not an event, related to each of the quality standards that already occurred.
- An activity is a single, specific action or task undertaken as part of a larger program or goal. An activity is often smaller in scale and focused on a particular objective. In contrast, an event is a broader, organized gathering or occasion involving multiple activities or efforts aimed at achieving a significant goal or impact. Events are typically, larger in scope and may involve multiple stakeholders. Events are often the culmination of planning and several activities.
