3. Eligible service providers participating in waiver and affirmation that they are in good standing:

Statewide waiver request for all participating SFSP and SSO sponsor organizations, in good standing, to provide meals during unanticipated school closures, as well as in a non-congregate setting during Novel Coronavirus outbreaks.

4. Description of the challenge the State agency is seeking to solve, the goal of the waiver to improve services under the Program, and the expected outcomes if the waiver is granted. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(iii) and 12(l)(2)(A)(iv) of the NSLA]:

The State Agency is requesting a waiver of SFSP requirement 7 CFR 225.6(d)(1)(iv) which would allow the State of New Jersey to approve the operation of SFSP and SSO meal service at school sites during unanticipated school closures. Additionally, the State Agency is requesting a statewide waiver to provide flexibility to the regulatory requirement, 7 CFR 225.6(e)(15), that stipulates that sponsors of the SFSP and SSO must maintain children on site while meals are consumed. Together these waivers would allow the New Jersey Department of Agriculture, Division of Food and Nutrition, to approve SFSP and SSO sponsors in good standing to provide meals during an unanticipated school closure in a non-congregate setting.

5. Specific Program requirements to be waived (include statutory and regulatory citations). [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(i) of the NSLA]:

The New Jersey Department of Agriculture requests a waiver for regulation 225.6(d)(1)(iv), allowing schools to serve as a meal site during an unanticipated school closure. Additionally, the New Jersey Department of Agriculture requests a waiver of regulation 7 CFR 225.6(e)(15), which requires SFSP and SSO sponsors to maintain children on site while meals are consumed.

6. Detailed description of alternative procedures and anticipated impact on Program operations, including <u>technology</u>, <u>State systems</u>, <u>and monitoring</u>: If approved, this will allow schools with an unanticipated school closure as a result of the coronavirus to serve meals to students in a non-congregate setting through SFSP and SSO of sponsors in good standing. Approval of this waiver will ensure that children have the necessary nutrition needed, assist with conserving other community resources for populations not served through the child nutrition programs and promote social distancing.

The State Agency will track the number of school sites and sponsors that were approved to utilize the waiver as well as number of meals served during the unanticipated school closure.

7. Description of any steps the State has taken to address regulatory barriers at the State level. [Section 12(l)(2)(A)(ii) of the NSLA]:

No state level barriers have been identified.
